With the government handling the rail-roads, the buck is passed from one person to another until it is impossible to pin anyone down and get cars. We are preparing to log extensively and manufacture lumber in the coming year, for everything looks favorable except the car situation—and that's bad."—Pacific Coast Manufacturer.

The intention of the four and five cent interest limitation! measure initiated in Oregon is to supply farmers, home build ers and merchants cheaper money. Of course, it could hardly be expected that outside Cleaning and Pressing capital would come to Oregon for investment if it could get higher rates of interest elsewhere-it would be loaned elsewhere. 
