He was thrown under the rear ear. His left leg was cut off below the knee and it was necquarry for surgeons to amputate the right leg, which was badly crushed. Gabert, who is 20 years old, resides at 308 Stanton street, with his mother and sister. He has been employed at the Boshong company since he returned from France a year ago.

On income of \$2400 per year it is suggrested that a family of two adults and three children should spend \$480 for food, \$408 for shelter, \$312 for clothing, \$400 pay \$1000 cash, balance can be arranged. for operating expenses, such as laundry, fuel, light, water, help, house furnishings, etc., \$200 for insurance, church and flub dues. charity, services of physician and dentist and recreation; \$600 for education, books, magazines, newspapers and savings. The \$150 cash, balance fike rent. amounts suggested in the proposed budgets are tentative and must vary to fit particular needs, but the habit of placing house hold expresses on a budget basis is recommended by the officials of the Peniusula National Bank as a sure method of increasing savings and getting the most out 12700, terms can be arranged. of an income, dournal,


