Mrs. T. C. Waite went to Dilley, Oregon, last Friday and returned Sunday with her two little grandchildren whose mother passed away several weeks ago.

William Surber has purchased the tobacco and soft drink establishment of William Preston opposite the St. Johns Hardware store on Jersey street. Mr. Surber has joined forces with Mr. Tripp of Philadelphia street soft drink establishment and the partition at the rear of the Surber store has been removed and the two places connected.

The fifth and sixth terms of James John high school entertained the freshmen Monday night at the high school. The address of welcome was given by W. T. Fletcher, principal of the high school, and a talk given by Oliver Jessup, president of the student body. Initiation of freshmen followed the program. Ice cream and wafers were served to the 150 who attended.

Mrs. Ella Mary Lange died at the home of her daughter, Mrs. S. L. Knowles, 967 S. Kellogg street, February 27th, of cancer. She was aged 64 years, 1 month and 13 days, and came from Pullman, Wash., to this place about three weeks ago. She is survived by her husband, three sons and two daughters, all of the children residing in Portland. The funeral services were held Monday at 10 a. m. in the chapel of the St. Johns Undertaking Co. Interment in Rose City cemetery.

The Red Cross Shop of Portland wants to turn the waste newspapers and magazines of Portland into funds for the use of the Portland Chapter of that organization. To do this it is organizing a drive to be held for one day, Saturday, March 13, at which time its volunteer army of occupation, the Boy Scouts, will collect all the waste papers and discarded magazines which may be donated to the cause by the people of the city. It is asked that the people save their papers until March 13, and that they then put them at their front door steps in bundles. The Scouts will do the rest.

Two fires, which started from sparks from chimneys driven by a high wind, caused considerable damage at two residences in the St. Johns district last Friday afternoon. The first occurred at 812 South Willamette boulevard, at a residence owned by W. G. Waterbury of Newberg, Or., and occupied by J. A. Campbell. Damages to roof and furniture were estimated at \$700. The second occurred at 816 North Seneca street when the residence of Mrs. J. D. Kellner was almost entirely destroyed by fire which started in the roof. Most of the clothing belonging to Mrs. Kellner, her son, Mr. Lewis Kellner, and her daughter and her husband, Mr. and Mrs. Thelma Loomen, was destroyed. Furniture on the lower floor was saved.

The Evangelical Conference will meet in Corvallis on April 30th, and Rev. A. P. Layton will then be transferred to another charge, having accepted the call of five years in St. Johns. The people of St. Johns in general will regret very much to lose Rev. Layton and his most estimable family from this community. Not only has he been active and faithful in church affairs, but has taken a lively interest in civic affairs as well, especially in matters having a tendency toward the moral uplift and betterment of conditions in St. Johns. The Evangelical church was never in better shape in every way than under his administration. A good man to the community as well as to his church will be lost when Rev. Layton leaves us.
