One of the most important developments in recent months is the announcement that arrangements have been perfected for financing a house building campaign in this district. It has been realized for several years that lack of good houses has been seriously delaying the growth of all of this part of the Peninsula. Homes for the people employed here have not been provided to keep pace with the expansion of the industries and public works in this

Appreciating the need for more good houses the business men of the entire district have banded together to take steps to relieve the shortage. A stock and leading business houses, as services, well as a number of the professional men, having subscribed for shares. The capital stock of \$25,000 is to be used as a revolving fund, whatever proceeds accrue from the sale of the houses, going back into the fund so that more can be built. It is under-stood that if any profits accrue they will also be turned back into the fund until the shortage of housing facilities is relieved.

The houses to be built will be of several different types and will be the very best that can be built for the price asked for them. The company will have the advantage of buying materials in quantities and can save in other ways through the cooperation of the stockholders, who are all leading business

This is a step in the right direction. Good houses for the people already employed here are as much needed as new industries that will bring in more people. It is especially gratifying to learn that the new company has no intention of building cheap shacks or rows of unsightly "factory houses." Evidently its organizers appreciate the fact that the people employed in the industries in this neighbrhood L. SIMMONS & CO., Grocers are prosperous and want houses that they and the community can be proud of.

An offer of \$32,340 for the Ladd & Strong tract of forty-four acres in the St. Johns district was authorized by the city council this morning as a means of acquiring a park site in that section of the city and settling of controversy that has been raging for several months. 




