## St. Johns Man

For Attorney General

Choice of George M. Brown for Prosecution of Land Fraud Cases



J. O. BAILEY

A resident of St. Johns, and who is a candidate for Attorney General on the Republican ticket, has been Assistant Attorney General for the past five years. As a witness in the famous Hyde-Benson land fraud suits, Attorney General Brown stated:

"I saw, if I tried these cases personally, it was going to take all of my time. In the meantime I saw it was possible to obtain an assistant attorney that I believed to be entirely qualified to try these cases, and I attempted to get the best lawyer in Oregon I could for the money that was allowed me to try the Hyde-Benson cases."

"With that end in view, I invited John O. Bailey to become one of my assistants. He had no political pull with me, so far as I was concerned, and was selected simply for his own qualifications, and when he came into the office—in fact, before he came in—he was advised that he was selected particularly for his fitness to try these cases, and he was instructed to push them with all the vim and vigor possible."

In the Hyde-Benson and Pacific Livestock suits conducted by Mr. Bailey, the state recovered approximately 14,000 acres of land, valued at several hundred thousand dollars, and \$125,000 in money. In addition to the land fraud suits, Mr. Bailey has conducted, or participated in, during the past five years, most of the important litigation handled by the Attorney General's office.

Hon. Geo. M. Brown's resignation as Attorney General, to accept the position of the Supreme Court caused by the resignation of Justice A. S. Bennett, occurred too late to have the names of the candidates for Attorney General printed on the ballot, and Mr. Bailey's name will have to be written in.

Mr. Bailey has made good as Assistant Attorney General and should be elected Attorney General at the coming election. Do not forget to write his name on the ballot.
