Desirability of Oregon spruce
and juniper for manufacturing
pencils and penholders is largely
responsible for bringing to Port-
land the Morningstar-Pacific
Pencil company. The slats have
hitherto been made at Bend and
shipped east in carloads, but at
great disadvantage because of
this expensive method of getting
them to the source of graphite
lead. The new company plans to
make the completed pencil in
Portland as soon as it can get
under way early in the year.

Oregon still produces precious
metals in considerable volume,
according to figures on 1919 just
completed by the United States
geological survey. During that
year the output amounted to \$1,
514,255, including silver, copper
and gold. Baker county's mines
contributed all but \$185,813, of
the state's total mineral output.

Announcement has just been
made of an increase in capitaliza-
tion of the Columbia Basin Wool
Warehouse company from \$400,-
000 to \$1,200,000. More than half
of the additional \$800,000 will
be subscribed by the Portland
people.
