Fred Lockley in a recent issue of the Portland Journal gave a very interesting article concerning G. J. Lucier and some of his ancestors. The article in part says:

G. J. Lucier lives at St. Johns. His address is 805 North Edison street. His father, Joseph Lucier, was the son of Etienne Lucier. "My father had 14 children," said Mr. Lucier. "I was the eleventh. His father, Etienne Lucier, came from Canada. I am of French and Indian blood. My father married Louise Marteneau, whose father was French and whose mother was Indian. My mother is still living at 85. Father married her when she was 14 years old, at St. Paul. My father's sister married Mr. Lachapelle. He lived to be very old. My aunt also lived to a great age, dying at the age of 104. My father settled in what is known as French Prairie. One of the early

French settlers there was Joseph Gervais, for whom the town of Gervais is named. In the '50s St. Paul, St. Louis and Champeog were important points along the Willamette river, for in those days much of the travel was done by canoe or in the batteaux on the river."
