As a private citizen and a husband and father his life was all that could be desired, and his kindly, philosophical nature and cheering presence will be remembered long after he has passed to his reward in the better world beyond. Such men as Dr. Cook tend to make the world better and purer, and the community in which they reside are immeasurably benefited by their having lived in it. But his race is run, his course is ended, and his spirit has winged its flight to participate in and enjoy the delight and happiness in the broader and brighter world beyond.
