

**Regarding the Battery**

"Just as good as a new one" is a statement often made and seldom true. The need is for the good battery, the standard battery of honest construction, but many battery fixers have fallen for the idea that they can build a battery as well, but a lot cheaper than the manufacturer who uses volume production methods and who has the pick of the market for supplies. "The rebuilt battery," says Mr. Roche, local Willard service station man, "is often made of parts from discarded batteries which have just enough more life in them to get by the purchase date. A few new parts may be added, a new case and a lot of new paint and then the sad refrain, 'just as good.'" The car driver who wants satisfactory battery operation is advised by Mr. Roche to go to the authorized battery service station representing a standard make of battery. He is then getting more than a battery, he gets a battery with the reputation of a manufacturer who has thousands or millions of dollars invested in plant and equipment behind it.

People should be very careful that statements are correct in sending news items to newspapers. The editor does not have the time to investigate in each instance and must trust in large degree to the good faith of the contributor. If people realized how strict the law is regarding the giving of false information to newspapers they would use care in this regard. Publishers want all the news items of interest they can get as a rule, but the items must be correct. When a publisher receives an item, prints it in good faith and later finds the information false, he is very slow in using items from the same source in the future, if he does not adopt harsher measures.—Exchange.
