TRULY SEAT OF THE MIGHTY
Woolack in British House of Lords
Dates Back to the Reign of King Edward III.

In a place of honor in the British house of lords is a large red cushion right in front of the throne. It is about five feet long and two feet square at the ends, and is known as the woolack or historic seat of the lord chancellor of the realm. This is one of the sacred British institutions. Its installation as a seat of honor for the head of the judiciary department of the government dates back to the time of Edward III, when wool was the chief staple of England.

It was not, however, until the time of Henry VIII that the woolack was dignified and thoroughly established as an institution by the following enactment: "The lord chancellor, lord treasurer and all other officers who shall be under the degree of a baron of a parliament shall sit and be placed at the uppermost part of the benches in the midst of the parliament chamber, either there to sit upon one form or upon the uppermost neck."

Another curious circumstance is the fact that the woolack is regarded as extra-territorial so far as the house is concerned. Technically, it is outside the precincts of the house, so, if the lord chancellor wishes to speak in debate he must leave the woolack and advance to his place as a peer.
