SUMMONS

Allie H. Helms, Plaintiff, vs. Frank T. O'Connor and Nora O'Connor, his wife, Defendants.
To Frank T. O'Connor and Nora O'Connor, his wife, the above named defendants: In the name of the State of Oregon, you and each of you are hereby required to appear in said court and cause and answer the complaint filed against you in the above entitled suit, on or before Monday, the 14th day of August, 1922, said date being six weeks from the date of first publication of this summons and if you fail so to appear and answer, for want thereof the plaintiff will apply to the court for the relief prayed for in her complaint hereto to wit:
