The State of Oregon is the oldest of the northwest but in some respects lacks the development of its neighbors. It has not yet reached a million in population while its offspring to the north, the state of Washington, has passed the million mark and has several cities past the hundred thousand mark, while our own state boasts of but one city of that class. There is some good reason for difference in growth of the two states. Advertising of our resources to the world no doubt is a vital factor in state or city growth. We see this exemplified to the highest in our neighbor to the south. California is no doubt the best advertised state in the Union and is making the greatest material growth of any of the states.

It was the idea of the projectors of the exposition to advertise our state more extensively. The growth of the city and state was rapid after the Lewis and Clark fair and would no doubt be even greater now could we have a fair. Thousands of people are headed to the coast states. The defeat of the proposition by the voters of the state has nipped this advertising project in the bud. The question now is—What are we going to do to get our share of new people and new industries that only need to know more of us to become a part of us?

The Shriners meeting here in 1920 was a great event and helped our city. We should by all means have more of such conventions. How about the Elks convention?

The big majorities given in favor of the Burnside and Ross Island bridges at the election last when the people see the great need to shorten the distance to the need of a thing they will gladly have it, even though it costs several million dollars, and will eventually have to be paid for by them.

The Burnside bridge has been declared unsafe and had to be replaced. The southern section of the city needed a bridge farther south than the Hawthorne bridge. The next bridge to be built must be across from St. Johns. The industrial section of the city is fast moving north. The ten thousand people of this section need a bridge to connect up with the industries of the west side and to shorten the distance to the heart of the city.

We should convince the electorate of our city of the necessity for this bridge that when the time is ripe the vote will be just as favorable as it was for the two bridges voted on at the last election.

Last week was generally observed as Good Book week and no doubt many books were read that would not have been had it not been for the publicity given through the papers, booksellers, schools, libraries and other agencies.

Good book week is a fine thing for old or young and should not be confined to one week. There are 51 other weeks in the year it is just as important to class as good book week. The idea of stressing one week in particular is to get us in the habit and the habit once formed we will throughout the year avail ourselves of the vast number of good books offered us and thus broaden our minds and increase our knowledge.

Continue the habit of last week and make it a year of delving into that class of literature that means higher and nobler things.

The port of Portland has something of which to boast in facts and figures just given out placing this port as second on the Pacific coast in tonnage of cargo entered and cleared to and from foreign ports. It not only ranks next to San Francisco on this coast but ranks eighth of all the ports of the United States.

Our weakness lies in the fact our exports are so far in excess of our imports. It is encouraging to know our imports are increasing, but until this port has the service of ships given to other ports can we hope to attain the standing we deserve in imports to this coast.

More business and less politics in government city, county, state and national will do more towards reduction of the universal criticism of government and government officials than any other one thing.

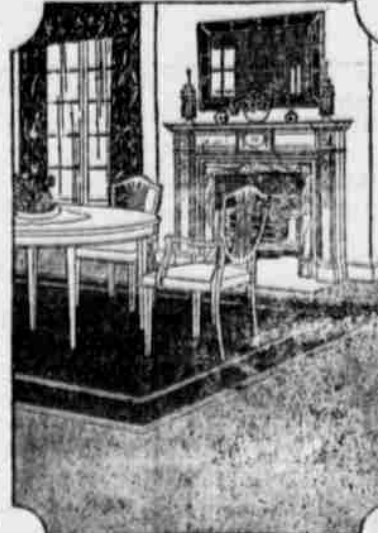
