The state of Oregon is to be congratulated on its standing in the literacy table of the states of the Union. It is exceeded by only one state, Iowa, in the low percentage of illiteracy among its inhabitants. Only 1.8 per cent of the people of this state are unable to read and write, while the average for the nation as a whole is 6 per cent.

Our nation has a greater number of illiterates than any country of Europe. This can be accounted for by our lax immigration laws that have been in effect for so many years. This country has been the dumping ground for millions of foreigners, especially from the Slavic states of southern Europe. This great influx has lowered our literacy rate and has not added anything to our standing as a first class nation. This influx has been curtailed by recent immigration laws. A further reduction and restrictions imposed on the class of people coming to our shores would be a good thing for our country.

In this season of good cheer and charitable deeds the results obtained by the American Relief Association this year is a shining light. The work of this great association is not yet complete. There is still much suffering, especially in Russia. Food and clothing remittance blanks can be had at the Peninsula National Bank, every cent of the proceeds of which go to buy clothing and food for suffering humanity. We have numbers of foreign birth and others, who no doubt, will call at the local bank and buy these food and remittance blanks in order to help a starving people.
