It is said by men well known in worldly affairs that the average American home is the most undemocratic place on earth. There the ideals and customs of our forefathers are cast aside. The youth today upon reaching the age of 18 or 20 usually thinks the reins should be taken from the parental hands and placed in his. The parents take the back seat and he proceeds to explain the whys and wherefores. In a good many cases the fault lies with the parents themselves—when granted the privilege of correction and we might take a good lesson from some of the foreign countries, rated far below us in civilization, to hold their parents in reverence and respect their commands.

That the Pacific Northwest is increasingly popular as a national playground is shown in figures just given out by the Portland office of the U. S. Forest Service. The estimate, which is based on reports from the forest rangers, gives a total of 1,029,972 people who sought recreation within the boundaries of the National Forests of Oregon and Washington during 1922. Of this number, 457,706 visited the National Forests of Oregon and 572,266 those of Washington.

F. L. Lipman, president of the Wells Fargo Nevada National Bank of San Francisco, says, "The more frequent causes of failure in life come after the college years, for most men at some point of their career, sooner or later stop trying, and whenever they do stop their progress ceases."

The S. P. Railroad Co. has placed orders for freight and passenger equipment to cost 12 million dollars, that is to be delivered in 1923. Most of this equipment will be used in the Pacific coast states for moving the products of these states. This big equipment order should go a long way towards relieving the annual car shortage we have.
