The master cook, preceded by trumpeters and other men with boar spears and drawn falchions and pages carrying mustard bore the smoking head aloft on a silver platter, which he deposited at the head of the table. The head was garaished and garlanded with rosemary and laurel, and a lemon, symbol of plenty, was placed between its

grinning chops.

To the sud of her life, Queen Victoris retained the ancient custom; alse in many of the public schools and universities the boar's head is still the great dish of the Christmas ban-quet.
