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DRUGS & VICE ARRESTS TWO IN CONNECTION W/ HEROIN OVERDOSE DEATHS

On January 16, 2015, officers assigned to the Portland Police Bureau's Drugs and Vice Division (DVD) arrested two men as part of two heroin overdose death investigations. 41-year-old Arturo Pineda-Chavez and 36-year-old Dimas Rafael Laso-Barrajona were booked into the Multnomah County Jail on charges of Distribution and Possession of Heroin. DVD officers investigated overdose deaths on January 9 and 13, 2015. As part of these investigations, officers obtained information and evidence that resulted in the arrests of Pineda-Chavez and Laso-Barrajona. In Multnomah County, heroin abuse and overdose deaths continue to be a significant issue for the community. According to the Oregon State Medical Examiner, there were 59 heroin overdose deaths in Multnomah County in 2013, and an additional 45 from methamphetamine. 2014 numbers have not yet been tabulated. DVD is notified on every drug overdose death in the City of Portland. If there are investigative leads to follow, (i.e. information on who supplied the narcotics), DVD officers focus efforts on identifying and arresting those responsible for putting the drugs in the hands of the deceased.

In 2014, DVD investigated 21 overdose deaths, primarily from heroin, for potential criminal prosecution. In 2014, DVD seized over 82 pounds of heroin (a significant jump from the 13 pounds seized in 2013), which translates to 7.4 million individual doses, any of which is potentially fatal.

DVD attributes many of these heroin overdose deaths to people who first became addicted to prescription pain medication then switch to heroin due to the cheaper cost. Additionally, in 2014, DVD seized 178 pounds of cocaine and 76 pounds of methamphetamine. Members of the Drugs and Vice Division created a documentary film about prescription drug abuse called Generation RX - The Pill Problem, narrated by KGW's Tracy Barry, to raise awareness about the reality of prescription drug abuse in Portland. DVD works closely with other local, state, and federal law enforcement agencies to investigate and eliminate illegal drug trafficking organizations (DTO's) in the Portland area and provides training and education on drug trends and illegal drug activity to other divisions within the Police Bureau as well as the community.

On Wednesday January 28, 2015, at 7:31 p.m., North Precinct officers responded to the report of an armed robbery at the Wendy's, located at 9800 Northeast Cascades Parkway. Officers arrived in the area and contacted employees who told police that the suspect was armed with a handgun as he demanded money. After obtaining an undisclosed amount of cash, the suspect ran out the door and rode away on a bicycle East towards Airport Way. Several officers checked the area but did not locate anyone matching the suspect's description. The suspect is described as a white male, 25 to 45 years old, thin build, blue eyes, wearing a gray hoodie with a skull print, a skull mask, riding a bicycle.
