One should ask: Is the property safe for future residents? In the rush to development, no one seems to be asking that important question. Also, with less clean up required of the site, it could continue to be a source of contamination to the Willamette River.

Though the neighborhood association's heart is in the right place, the need for effective clean up should temper enthusiasm for intense housing at the site. Tall buildings also may not be the best use of the riverfront that could create a connected greenway and help restore the health of the lower Willamette River.

Vanport Flood Commemoration Tour

On May 30, 1948 at 4:17pm a levee burst and the Columbia River flooded Vanport City, once the second-largest city in Oregon. This tour features speakers, visit to three sites with public art and informational signs and generally includes sharing by Vanport residents and families.

A World War II housing project, Vanport was home to nearly 100,000 people during its existence, hosted Vanport College (now PSU) and many innovative educational and social programs. It housed a large African American community as well as returning Japanese internees and World War II veterans.
