GANG-RELATED SHOOT-ING INVESTIGATION LEADS TO SEARCH WAR-RANT - 3 GUNS SEIZED, 3 **PEOPLE ARRESTED**

FlashAlert: July 15th, 2015 11:11 AM On Tuesday July 14, 2015, at 2:09 a.m., North Precinct officers responded to the report of gunfire in the area of North Albina Avenue and Ainsworth Street, Several officers arrived in the area and located evidence of gunfire but did not locate any gunshot victims. Gang Enforcement Team (GET) officers responded to conduct an investigation, which led to a search warrant being served late Tuesday at a residence in the 8700 block of North Tyndall Avenue. During the search, three handguns were seized as evidence, one vehicle was towed and three people were arrested on outstanding warrants.

17-year-old Rothell Davis was arrested for a probation violation.

17-year-old Judge Jonathan Edwards was arrested for a probation violation. 22-year-old Kourtney Alexis Henry was arrested on an outstanding warrant for Theft in the Second Degree. Davis and Edwards were lodged at the Donald E. Long Juvenile Detention Home, while Henry was booked into the Multnomah County Jail.

44-YEAR-OLD MAN IN MEN-TAL HEALTH CRISIS TAKEN TO HOSPITAL AFTER FIR-**ING HIS GUN IN HOME**

FlashAlert: July 13th, 2015 12:04 PM On Monday July 13, 2015, at 8:53 a.m., North Precinct officers responded to a residence in the 9800 block of N Clarendon Ave on the report of several gunshots heard inside a home. The caller reported that there was loud music coming from the home all morning and the resident had a history of mental health issues. Several offi-

cers responded to the area and established containment around the home. Officers at the scene contacted Project Respond and the Portland Police Bureau's Behavioral Health Unit (BHU) to assist with the call. At approximately 9:45 a.m., the 44-year-old male resident of the home came outside of his own volition and was taken into custody without incident. The man directed officers to several firearms in the home, which were taken as evidence. The man was taken to a Portland hospital on a hold for a mental health evaluation.

GANG ENFORCEMENT **TEAM OFFICERS ARREST 46-YEAR-OLD MAN ARMED** WITH A GUN, WEARING **BULLETPROOF VEST** News Release Portland Police Bureau

FlashAlert: July 13th, 2015 3:44 PM On Saturday July 11, 2015, at 7:53 p.m., Gang Enforcement Team (GET) officers conducted a traffic stop at NE Martin Luther King Jr. Blvd and Going St. Officers contacted the driver of the white 1996 Chevrolet Monte Carlo, 46-year-old Billy Troy Ballastressi, and determined that he was wearing a bulletproof vest. Officers arrested Ballastressi and determined that he also was in possession of a gun, cocaine, heroin and methamphetamine. Ballastressi was booked into the Multnomah County Jail on charges of Felon in Possession of a Firearm, Felon in Possession of Body Armor, Possession of a Loaded Firearm, Unlawful Possession of a Firearm, Possession of Heroin, Possession of Methamphetamine, Manufacturing Cocaine, Delivery of Cocaine, and Possession of Cocaine. The Tactical Operations Division is continuing to investigate several incidents of gun violence citywide. Anyone with information about gun crimes in the City of Portland is encouraged to provide information to the Portland Police Bureau's Tactical Operations Division at 503-823-4106. Information learned from social media sites such as Facebook, Twitter or YouTube should be shared with investigators as these tips may lead to the identification of a suspect or suspects.
