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PREHISTORIC REMAINS.

The skeleton of another Tall Man Recently Discovered Near Montone.

Fresh discoveries of human remains, probably prehistoric, were found this week on the Italian frontier near Montone. Two years ago the skeleton of a man more than 8 feet high was unearthed at the same spot under the direction of an English archaeologist. Workmen in a cave recently uncovered several slabs of stone which seemed to form a part of a dolmen. The earth contained many bones of animals, broken evidently for the extraction of the marrow, and there were indications of fire close by. Several small, pierced shells which once formed a chapelet and a row of stag's teeth were near at hand.

The skeleton of a man 6 feet 2 inches in height was lying on its back. The legs were crossed below the knee. The right arm was extended and bent backward toward the head. The hand was clenched. The left hand was placed under the head. The same position has been frequently observed in early Neolithic burials. A fine crystal of carbonate of lime beside the skeleton was undoubtedly a talisman. Further excavations in the cavern revealed innumerable bones of animals, notably a fine vertebra of a mammoth. Still another find is a flint implement, which appears to be of palaeolithic age.—Paris Letter.

TO BE TRIED FOR MALLING LITTLE QUESTIONS.
