TUESDAY NIGHT'S CONVENTION. The non-partizan convention at Shively's Wednesday had an attendance of about 250. C. H. Dye was chosen chairman, and Charles Meserve secretary. The chairman stated the object of the meeting, and talked at some length on the qualifications of the ticket named by the committee. A motion was made that the names selected by the committee last Thursday night be declared the nominees of the convention, but the motion failed to carry, and nominations were taken up,

Dr. Powell and E. G. Caufield were put in nomination for mayor, the former being selected by the committee, and the latter having only consented to the use of his name about 2 o'clock yesterday afternoon. Powell received 103 votes and Caufield 91; so Dr. Powell was declared duly nominated. For treasurer W. B. Wiggins, E. E. Martin, R. L. Holman and J. A. Thayer were nominated. The first ballot resulted, Wiggins 69, Martin 79, Holman 25, Thayer 14, scattering 2; there being no choice another ballot was ordered, but before it was taken Holman and Thayer withdrew, which left Martin and Wiggins. The second ballot resulted as follows: Martin 106, Wiggins 70; so Martin was declared the nominee for city treasurer.

Motion was made to divide the convention into wards for the seclection of councilmen, which was carried. J. L. Clark, I L. 2125.
Swafford was elected chairman and 'r. Criswell, W.A. 3355. Swafford was elected chairman and vr. Schuebel secretary of the first ward and Dr. Ferrin chairman and J. M. Lawrence secretary of the second ward. In the first ward G. W. Church, Geo. C. Ely, John Bittner and J. A. Heeckert were placed in nomination; Bittner and Heckert receiving the largest number of votes, were named as the councilmen from the first ward.

In the second ward Thos, Gault, L. C. Caples, S. S. Walker and Jas. Posey were placed in nomination, and the vote resulted in Gault and Caples being chosen for councilmen.

After the selection of the council, there being no other business the convention adjourned.


