THE CITY ELECTION.

Hiram Straight Re-Elected Mayor by Seven Majority.

The municipal election on Monday passed off in a very orderly manner. Both factions worked hard and had carriages out and brought in all the stray voters to be had.

Three hundred and forty votes were cast in the first ward and 347 in the second, a total of one vote more than was cast in 1893 when H. Straight defeated T. L. Charman by 238 majority, and 187 more votes than was cast at last city election.

Hiram Straight was re-elected for one year by seven majority and his son, H. E. Straight, for treasurer for one year by 72 majority. Three of the citizen's candidates were elected—Straight, Straight and Koerner, and three on law and order ticket—Bittner, Gault and Caples. Messrs. Stevens, Jagger, Howell and Broughton retire as councilmen on January 1st and Cooke, Porter, Moffatt and Meldrum hold over.

As we said last week the issue was not "saloon's against churches." It was the intention of part of those who ran the "reform" nomination to also run the citizens convention. They succeeded in having H. Straight nominated for reelection feeling sure they could with their combine forces beat him while they could not E. G. Causfeld, who they knew would carry the city, if nominated, by at least 200 majority. But they were mistaken as was shown by the counting of the votes. Some of the "reform" sponsors did not compare very favorably with the pullers for the other side, notwithstanding they were backed by the churches.
