Report of Roadmaster Kinnaird on completion of the bridge across Butte Creek on J. M. Drake approved; cost—contract price for bridge \$908, approach etc. \$279.53, total \$1247.53. Clerk ordered to send statement to Marion county court of its share in same.

Petition of C C Miller et al for view of a road granted and John C. Tracy, Granville Linn, Geo. C. Curran, Surveyor D. W. Kinnaird appointed to view to meet at place of beginning on December 30th at 10 a. m.

Suit of George Forman vs Clackamas county; Witness fees on part of county amounting to \$60.20 paid, all other claims laid over till January term.

Petition in regard to vacation of certain streets in Minthorn laid over till January term.

Four dollars per month allowed for care and keeping of Mrs. L. A. Donson after January 1st, payable to Dan Wyland.

Petition of Oregon City for assistance in constructing a bridge across Abernethy Creek granted and 40 per cent of cost ordered paid, as bridge is partly outside city limits on county road.

On payment of \$26.25 certain lands of Sarah Cornman ordered released for delinquent mortgage taxes of 1889, 1891 and 1892.

Claim of \$142.22 of Lindsley & Son for lumber on Molalla road ordered paid out of county fund.

Ten dollars per month allowed for care and keeping of Mrs. J. A. Lonsington and nine children, who are in destitute circumstances.

Petition of C Johnson for duplicate warrant not granted.

Reports of officers on collection of fees for November approved.
