PLATFORM.

We are in favor of the present existing laws being amended so as to compel all foreign emigrants to reside in the United States a period of seven years and to be able to read and write the English language before being granted the right of franchise.

We ask our representatives and senator to use their best endeavors to pass a law to give the voters of each precinct the privilege of electing their road supervisors.

As the salaries of many state and county officers are out of proportion to what the taxpayers are making since the good old democratic times have come, we ask the legislature of this state to lower all such salaries so that the burden of taxation may be reduced to conform to the income of the people that have to pay them.

We are in favor of the voters electing the U. S. senators by a popular vote and would request our representatives in congress to vote for an amendment to the constitution so that the will of the voter may not be disregarded and the states not be misrepresented.

We will not vote for anyone for representative unless he will pledge himself to vote and to work to abolish the railroad commission and also to lower the fare and freight rates on railroads.

We will not vote for anyone for the office of representative unless he will pledge himself to vote against appropriating any money for normal or any other school (the public schools excepted) as we believe it is not right to tax the poor to educate the children of the rich.

We pledge our candidates for the legislative assembly to favor the initiative and referendum by doing all in their power to cause all important state questions and local laws to be referred to the vote of the people interested so far as it can be done under our constitution.

We demand the enacting of a law or laws whereby those indulging in law suits shall be made to bear the burden of said suits; as fees charged by the officers for their services, and the officers to turn the same into the county, and to be held strictly accountable for the same. We requested those representing us in our legislative bodies to vote and work for said laws.

It is the sense of this convention that the county court, at its next session be petitioned and instructed to rest its wages to a basis of not less than \$1.50 per day for each man and \$3 a day for a man and his team employed on county roads.
