CHRISTIAN ENDEAVOURERS. Annual State Convention at Congregational Church, Oregon City, This Week.

The Congregational church was crowded on Tuesday evening to hear the opening exercises of the state convention.

The session opened with praise service, led by President H. S. Gile of Salem. Addresses of welcome were made by E. E. Charman, president of the board of trade, in behalf of city, and by C. H. Dye, in behalf of churches, with responses by Rev. J. P. Farmer of Salem.

At 6:30 a service prayermeeting was held, led by Rev. Scott of Salem. The report of Secretary W. I. Staley, of Salem, showed there were 279 senior societies and 106 junior in the state, being a gain of 39 senior and 12 junior societies during the year.

The 140 senior societies made financial reports showing that more than \$2000 had been collected for missions for 12 months. Treasurer Fred Lockley, Jr., of Salem, reported that \$431 had been collected from subscription during the year and \$399 expended, leaving a balance of \$32 on hand.

Wm. Shaw of Boston gave a very entertaining address. The following pastors discussed "What I know about Christian Endeavorers": Revs. Denton, Thompson, Curtis, Farmer, Rogers, Templeton, Pollny, Cowan and Montgomery.

During the afternoon reports from the different societies represented were made after which Mr. Shaw made another address. "What Our Church Rightly Expects of Us" was discussed by Mrs. Gilt, Rev. Thompson and Mrs. G. A. Green.
