HIGH GRADE GOODS. WOOLEN INDUSTRY BENEFITED BY FREE RAW MATERIALS. Better Products For the Same Price—A Saving of 6 Per Cent to Domestic Manufacturers—Plea For Protection Has Little Standing—Facts About Revenues.

It does not require much attention to measure the benefits derived from free wool. The wools which are of such inferior quality as to be only a little removed from shoddy are no longer imported in as large quantities as when a duty was imposed, wools of high grade and fine quality being substituted for them.

Manufacturers claim to have a grievance against the new tariff in that they are able to compete with foreigners in only a few kinds of goods. That taste, patterns and machinery should have become specially adapted to such wools as the greed of the woolgrowers imposed upon the domestic market was to be expected, and it could hardly be anticipated that in a single 12 months a change so radical could be wrought as to enable the home manufacturer to meet entirely and successfully the new conditions.
