STREET CAR ACCIDENT.—A frightful street-car accident occurred in Portland on Tuesday morning, on East Morrison street, between Eighth and Ninth, involving the death of four persons and the injury, more or less severely, of 18 more people. Car 52, of the City & Suburban line, running between Mount Tabor and the West Side, in charge of Conductor Stephen Guthrie, with John G. Kieffer as motorman, jumped the track while crossing a bridge at high speed, and dashing over the roadway through the frail wooden guards, built for the protection of pedestrians, and plunged into a slough of water 20 feet below.
