

COUNTY COURT.

Adjourned Term Monday, September 27th.

Present: Gordon Hayes, judge; Frank Jaggard and S. F. Marks, commissioners. This adjourned session Monday was held to open the bids received for building a wagon road to the Willamette Falls.

The bids as submitted were: John Burke, 25 cents per yard for dirt, 44 for loose rock, 62 for solid rock, hard pan 30 cents a yard. To improve the building of trestle work for 5 per cent of the cost.

Dan Lyons bid 13 for earth, 35 for loose rock, 75 for solid rock, clearing and grubbing right of way \$50 per acre. To put in all bridges for 20 per cent above actual cost of labor and material.

Smyth & Howard bid 12 for earth, 38 for loose rock, 70 for solid rock.

The specifications indicated that there would be 5,540 yards of solid rock, 1,200 of loose rock and 3,703 of dirt and estimated the cost at: Loose dirt 18 cents a yard, loose rock 45, solid rock, \$1.

On the engineer's estimate of the amount of material to be moved the bids amounted to \$4,778.38 for Smyth & Howard, \$4,888.05 for John Burke of Portland, \$4,996.59 for Dan Lyons.

After taking the matter under advisement at noon the court awarded the contract to Smyth & Howard.

The contract covers the building of 6,000 linear feet of new road commencing at a point north of the West Side electric station and going westward toward Willamette Falls and practically covers the entire cost of the road as the balance is through loose dirt that can be easily and cheaply handled.
