REPUBLICAN COUNTY CENTRAL COMMITTEE MEETING.

Pursuant to call the republican county central committee of Clackamas county met in the city council chamber, in this city, at 1:30 Saturday afternoon.

The meeting was called to order by Chairman S. M. Ramsby, and the first business was the apportionment of delegates for the county convention.

A motion was made that one delegate be allowed upon a basis of every 20 votes cast for McKinley at the last presidential election.

The matter of judges and clerks of elections was next discussed. A. J. Yoder, of Marquam, specially desired that judges and clerks be appointed for the primary in his precinct.

E. J. Swafford was in favor of judges and clerks at some of the primaries, and made a motion that each committee have the privilege of appointing judges and clerks in his precinct.

T. S. Stipp, of Molalla precinct, said that if judges and clerks were appointed in his precinct, there would hardly be any voters left on the outside to vote.

C. T. Howard did not believe in closing the doors of the primaries to populists. He said there were many populists in his neighborhood.

He said that some of them were weak-kneed and should be given an opportunity to return to the republican fold.

In fact, he thought the populist friends should be treated with mercy. J. M. Tracy wanted the privilege of appointing judges and clerks, or not, just as the conditions would warrant.

Mr. Van Curen, of Damascus, stated that they had always given everyone who wished so, an opportunity to vote in his precinct.

It was decided to hold the primaries on April 2nd, and the county convention at 9 a. m. on April 6th.

The primaries to be held at two p. m., except where otherwise designated by the committee.

It was voted to hold the county convention at Weinhard's hall. On motion of T. F. Ryan, the committee members of each precinct are required to have a list of delegates with the secretary of the county central committee.

At 8 a. m. on the day of the convention, and that no proxies of delegates be given to anyone residing outside of the precinct, where they are elected.
