Some 8 or 10 tons came from Oregon City and the Clakamas, but the first were not up to the standard of excellence of those generally sent from this section at the first of the season, being, evidently, the result of several day's fishing and consisting largely of steelheads many which were caught on their spawning beds. Some were spent fish having booked noses and being attenuated and having livid streaks down the sides, fish that ought not to be sent to market at all. While there were some fine large fresh-run chinooks yet a large proportion of these tish had evidently been caught far up the Clack-amas and been bauled long distances atter being caught before being shipped.
