### COMMENTARIES.

**Matters Concerning Local Everyday Affairs Noticed by the Courier Reporter.**

Last Monday was the holiest of all Jewish holidays—Yom Kippur, or the day of atonement, and was generally observed by the Jewish residents of Oregon City. It is considered the Sabbath of Sabbaths, and is the only day in the year when the entire congregation of Israel is commanded for holy convocation, to abstain from all worldly affairs and to pass the day in fasting from eve to eve. In the temple of old it was the function of the high priest after offering the special sacrifices of the day to confess his own sin before God, and then to confess the sins of the people. Yom Kippur is observed on the 10th day of the seventh month of 'Teshri.'

The Oregon City Volunteers all express delight at having their quarters changed from Cavite to Manila, notwithstanding their keen disappointment in not being permitted to participate in glory of the taking of Manila. Some of them even express a desire to remain there during the full term of enlistment, but the novelty of the new situations will soon likely wear away, and they will again long for a drink of Willamette juice pumped out of the basin.

From present indications the members of both houses are in a fair way to swamp the legislature with bills. If all pass that are being introduced at this special session, there will be but little need of the regular session in January.

### Legislative Holdups.

Contest proceedings were begun in the house Monday by John Denison, republican candidate for the legislature in Clackamas county, to unseat George Knight, silver republican representa-

tive. The claim is based on erroneous voting, in that, voters made one mark for three legislative candidates in brackets. Such votes were cast on both sides and were counted for but the one candidate before whose name the mark was made. Denison claims 24 plurality on errors in 31 precincts. George G. Bingham, of Salem, is Denison's attorney.—Capital Journal.

Reports from Salem indicate that the opposition to Corbett are scheming to prevent a caucus—believing that they can encompass his defeat in this way. It is probable that some of the members known to be ardent supporters of Mitchell, knew of this scheme when they surprised their constituents by announcing that they would support Corbett, provided he was nominated in the caucus.

There are said to be about 200 applicants for clerkships swarming around the corridors of the capitol building. It is likely that about 150 of them will return to their respective homes without having secured the coveted plums.

Representative Kruse has introduced a bill to increase the facilities for the alleviation of suffering and for the prevention and cure of disease, and repealing all acts in conflict therewith. Mr. Kruse has also introduced a bill providing for the nomination of candidates for United States senators, by the qualified voters of the state.

Senator Brownell introduced the first bill in the senate—to abolish the railroad commission, which has reached a second reading. Among other bills he has introduced is one providing for a convention to formulate a new state constitution.

Senator Porter is chairman of the committee on public lands, and is also a member of the committee on assessment and taxation. Senator Brownell is chairman of the committee on railroads, and is also a member of the committee on elections. Mr. Porter is, also a member of the committee on education. The members of the house committees were not appointed when this paper went to press.
