

BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS.

Regular April Term of the County Board.

S. F. Marks, chairman; J. R. Morton, R. Scott, commissioners.

Be it remembered, that at a regular session of the board of county commissioners for the county of Clackamas, state of Oregon:

Began and held in the court house of said county and state on Wednesday, the 8th day of March, 1899, the same being the regular time fixed by said board for holding a regular session of said board for the transaction of county business.

In the matter of the damage suit of Ernest Boehman vs. Clackamas county. Now comes said Ernest Boehman by his attorneys and offers to settle said suit for the sum of \$500, and costs amounting to \$21.40, and the board being fully advised, it is ordered that said offer be accepted and the clerk is hereby instructed to issue a warrant for said amount in favor of Ernest Boehman.

In the matter of—Brigham for a rebate of taxes. Now comes Brigham by his attorney W. S. U'Ren, and petitions the board for a rebate of a portion of the cost on certain delinquent taxes and the board not being fully advised, it is ordered that said matter be laid over until the May term of the board.

In the matter of building a bridge on upper Eagle Creek on the line between road districts 8 and 9. Now comes Messrs. Paulsen and Miller before the board and represent that they have about completed a road on both sides of said creek at their own expense (of about \$1000), when completed and in consideration of said work they ask the county to build them a bridge across said creek and the board being fully advised, it is ordered that when road is completed the county will build said bridge.

In the matter of the petition of Ed Graves, et al, for a county road; this matter having been laid over from the March term, and the board being fully advised, it is ordered that Chris. Kocher, G. W. Prosser and Dave McArthur be and are hereby appointed as viewers to meet at a place of beginning on the 20th day of April, 1899, and subscribe to a written order of office administered by E. P. Randis, a skillful surveyor, he being appointed by the board to survey said road, before proceeding to view and locate said road and report in writing at the next regular term of this board.

In the matter of the request of C. F. Clark of road district No 2 in regard to distribution of road money. Now comes C. F. Clark and represents to the board that it would be for the best interests of his district to have the trunk road of their district used for the trunk road at Clackamas, Sunnyside and Happy Hollow. And the board being fully satisfied, it is ordered that the road money of said district be spent on extension of trunk lines where most traveled.

In the matter of the petition and subscription list from road district No 9. This matter coming on now to be heard and the board being fully advised, it is ordered that \$100 one hundred dollars be allowed said district.

In the matter of the opening of the change in the Dayton and Oregon City road. Now comes P. A. Baker and G. E. Hayes before the board and represent that said road should be opened at once, and the board being fully advised, it is ordered that said road be opened at once, and the clerk is directed to issue the necessary orders to Supervisor Aden of district No 31.

In the matter of the resignation of Fred Schaffer, as supervisor of road district No 22, it is ordered by the board that the resignation of Fred Schaffer as supervisor in district No 22, be accepted, and that Albert Engle be appointed to fill said vacancy.

In the matter of aid for Mrs. Walker an indigent person, it is ordered by the board that Mrs. Walker be given an order on the Red Front Trading Company for \$7.50 worth of goods.

In the matter of building a bridge in road district No 25, it is ordered by the board that Supervisor Barth of said district be ordered to build said bridge.

In the matter of the payment of claims filed against Clackamas county, the board of county commissioners having examined said claims and being fully satisfied, it is ordered by the board that the clerk shall issue warrants on the general fund in favor of the persons for the amounts hereinafter specified in payment of said claim:
