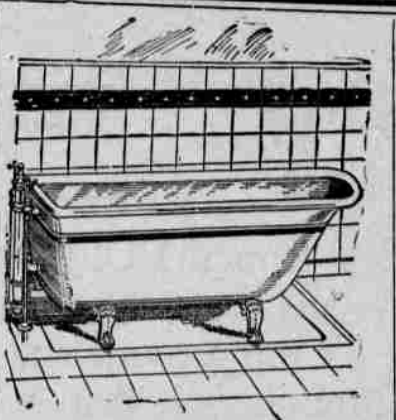

BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS

Proceedings of the June Term of the County Board. THURSDAY, June 1st, 1899.

Before the board of county commissioners of the state of Oregon for the county of Clackamas, in vacation after the May term of said board, to-wit: In the matter of certain claims ordered paid in vacation: In pursuance of an order of this board made and entered of record ordering warrants to be issued in vacation, I, Elmer Dixon, clerk of said county and state, do hereby issue warrants in payment of said claims for the amounts and in favor of the persons hereinafter specified: Mrs. E. Morgan, pauper account. \$10 00

WEDNESDAY, June 7th, 1899. Be it remembered that at a regular session of the board of county commissioners for the county of Clackamas, state of Oregon, begun and held in the court house in said county and state on Wednesday, the 7th day of June, 1899, the same being the regular time fixed by said board for holding a regular session of said board for the transaction of county business.

It is ordered that Supervisor Crossin be allowed \$130 for road work in district No. 28. It is ordered that Supervisor Heia be allowed \$100 for road work in district No. 28.

It is ordered that on request of Sheriff Cooke, that the time for the collection of taxes be extended to July 1st, 1899. It is ordered that County Surveyor Rands make a survey of the Gray's Mill and Oregon City road and report same at the next regular meeting of the board.

In the matter of opening the Bonney road, it is ordered that Supervisor Mattson open said road at a cost not to exceed \$75. Upon request of Mr. Sneiff, it is ordered that Supervisor Sneiff use \$75 in repairing east end of Molalla and Canby road.

It is ordered that board accept invitation to attend dedication exercises of the Y. M. C. A. In the matter of opening the Gray's Mill and Cutting road—Now comes Supervisor Bonney, of road district No. 21, and reports that he had started to improve said road outside of the limits of his district, and he now asks that Supervisor Engle, of district No. 22, in which district the part of said road lies where he started to improve, and the board being fully advised, it is ordered that Supervisor Engle, of district No. 22, be ordered to finish the improvement of said road.

It is ordered that Supervisor Hutchinson be allowed \$60 for road work in district No. 20. In the matter of fencing up the Cochran and Killen road, the board being informed that Mr. Pope, who owns property along said road, intends to fence on said road, claiming it is not a legal road, and the board being satisfied that Supervisor Taylor, of road district No. 35, in which said road is situated, be instructed to notify Mr. Pope not to fence in said road.

It is ordered by the board that Supervisor Bonney be allowed \$90 for road work in road district No. 21. Board now adjourned, to meet tomorrow, June 8th, at 9:30 a. m.
