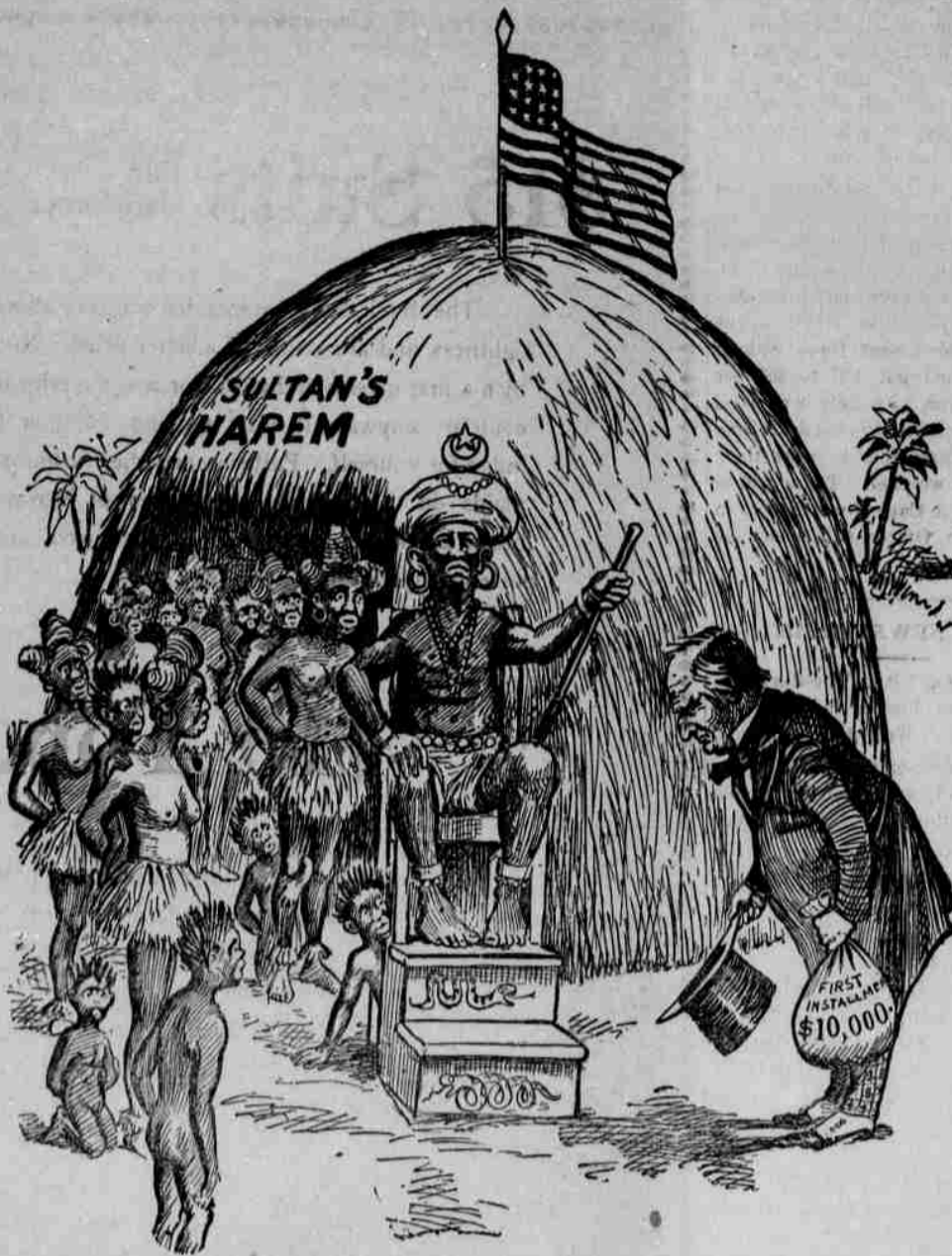

At a recent meeting the corporation of Widnes unanimously decided, on the recommendation of the gas and water committee, to again reduce the price of gas 1d per 1000 cubic feet. This will make the net price 1s 3d (30 cents) per 1000 cubic feet to consumers of over 3,000,000 cubic feet per annum and 1s 5d (34 cents) to ordinary consumers.
