FRATERNAL NOTES.

A. O. U. W. Open Meeting at Canby.

A delegation from Falls City Lodge, A. O. U. W., visited Gavel Lodge at Canby last Friday night. W. H. Evans, master workman, the other officers, members and their wives accorded the visitors a royal welcome. The exercises took place in Knight's hall, the meeting place of the local lodge. Ex-Sheriff E. C. Maddock, the first master workman of Gavel lodge, presided, and opened with some strong arguments in favor of fraternalism. The next speaker was County Judge Thomas F. Ryan, who is well versed in fraternal matters, and knows something of the good accomplished by the workmen organization. Senator George C. Brownell made an earnest plea for the A. O. U. W., and cited instances of benefits that had accrued to its members. Hon. Gordon E. Hayes made convincing arguments for the good of the order, and cited some strong points in favor of the workmen lodge. C. H. Dye, who is a past master workman and an officer of the grand lodge, made stirring and touching appeals for the good of the order. Justice C. Schuebel, also made an excellent short talk on workmanship.

John D. Stevens was called upon, and expressed regrets that his age prevented him from becoming a workman. He was an ardent believer in fraternalism, and that it expressed the best possible condition of mankind. Mr. Stevens explained how the Southern Pacific had made a flag station of Canby for the overland train, which had deprived them of convenient mail facilities. He further explained how he went to Portland at the instance of the people of Canby, and made complaint to the railroad company. He was informed that the service had been cut down on account of the increased expense, occasioned by the members of the railway telegraphers' union demanding extra pay for overtime. He also seen the railway mail service department. The trains began making the usual stops on the following day.

After the speeches the crowded hall-way was cleared for dancing. An excellent orchestra, consisting of William Covey, B. Tull, Frank Jesse and David Will furnished music. A banquet was served in the Hodges storeroom by the wives of the Canby workmen, and the bill of fare was complete. Roast meats, chicken, pies, cakes and juicy Canby watermelons, hot coffee, etc., were among the dainties excellently served. The young people continued dancing until daylight.
