Sheriff's Report.

Sheriff Cooke has filed his report of
collection of taxes with the county clerk,
and it proves a very interesting docu-
ment to the taxpayers of Clackamas
county. The amount of uncollected
taxes, as shown by the records, is small-
er than it has been for ten years past.
Even last year the uncollected taxes af-
ter the sale was \$1062.56, and it is much
less this year. One important feature is
the fact that all the costs of posting,
printing and other expenses are paid out
of the proceeds of the sale and will not
come out of the pockets of the taxpay-
ers. It is one of the best conducted tax
sales, from an economic point of view,
ever made in Clackamas county. Fol-
lowing is the statement:

To the Hon. Board of Commissioners
of Clackamas County, State of Oregon:

I, J. J. Cooke, sheriff and tax collector
of said county and state, do hereby sub-
mit to your honorable body the follow-
ing statement of taxes as charged to my-
self for the year 1898, together with the
amounts collected and uncollected and
double assessments and erroneous, for
your approval in final settlement of said
taxes of 1898.
