Best in Clackamas County for Years.

A VERY HARMONIOUS CONVENTION.

A Clean Ticket Throughout—A Striking Contrast to the One-Man Ticket of the Republicans.

The above ticket was put up by the citizens' convention on last Friday,

and proved a boomerang in the republican camps, which were predicting a slated ticket and an unharmonious convention. The ticket is clean and is free from bossism and unholy alliances, which were characteristic of the Brownell ticket put up by the so-called republican convention a week previous, and will be supported by a large number of independent republican voters who are opposed to boss rule and combinations to turn down good men because they will not stand in with the machine.

On Friday morning the populist and democrat parties met separately and elected delegates to their respective state conventions and officers of committee. At about 3:30 p. m. the delegates met in joint mass convention as citizens and proceeded to put up a first class ticket and platform, which they did in a manner satisfactory to all concerned. The convention was the most harmonious one that has been held in Clackamas county for 15 or 20 years and the best of feeling and good fellowship prevailed throughout.

The platform promulgated by the platform committee and unanimously adopted by the convention proved the wisdom of the chairman in naming the personnel of the committee.

The vindictive and discordant element was conspicuous by its absence, as was its leader who had heretofore taken part in reform conventions. This element has begun already to circulate stories about this man and that man being Brownell men, and hopes thereby to

create discord or friction. Citizens, we caution you at this time not to believe all the absurd stories circulated by and for the opposition.

This convention consisted of between 250 and 300 substantial citizens of Clackamas county who had the welfare of the county at heart and were not after office. In this case the man did not seek nomination for office. Never before in the history of Clackamas county has such a body of taxpayers met in convention to nominate a ticket, and never was there such harmony and good feeling, and if the citizens will put their shoulders to the wheel and stand together from now until election day we will elect every man on our ticket, besides helping the cause of human liberty.

In the near future we will give a short sketch of the personnel of the ticket put up by the masses in opposition to the class ticket put up by Brownell and his gang for Hanna, Simon & Co., the owners of Oregon.

Following is a detailed report of the conventions:

People's Party County Convention.

The people's party county convention was called to order at Shivel's opera house at 11 a. m., Friday by County Chairman, Henry Thiessen, who announced that the object of the convention was to elect 15 delegates to attend the state convention and to attend to matters pertaining to party organization. He stated that the first order of business was the election of a temporary chairman. W. L. Holcomb placed in nomination W. W. Myers, of Maple Lane. C. M. Larkins named George Ogle, of Molalla. Mr. Myers declined and presented a motion, which prevailed that Mr. Ogle be the unanimous choice for chairman. W. W. Austin, of Logan, was chosen secretary by acclamation.

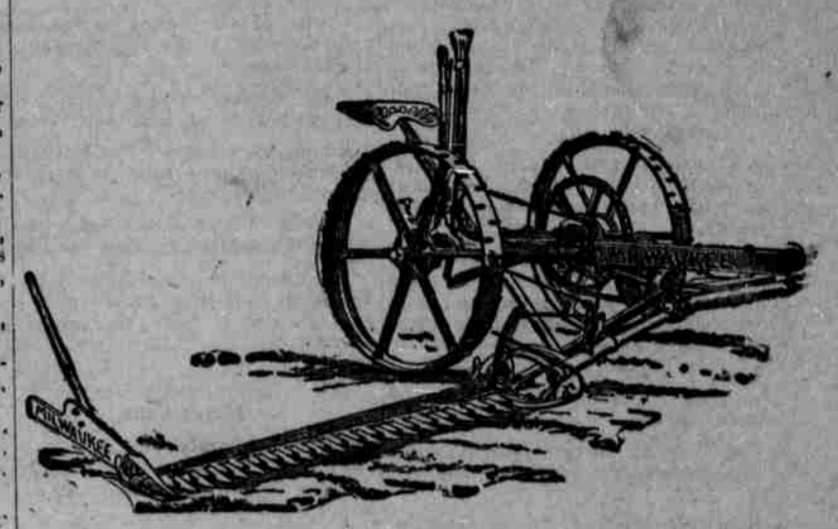

Joint or Citizens' Conventions.

The delegates comprising the separate democratic and people's party conventions were called to order in Shivel's opera house at 4 p. m., Friday, by George Ogle. C. D. Latourette, Robert A. Miller, W. W. Myers, and George Ogle were named for chairman. The three latter declined and Latourette was nominated by acclamation. The newly elected chairman responded with a short speech on national subjects, which was well received. Elmer Dixon was unanimously elected secretary of the convention.
On motion, the chairman appointed the following committee on order of business: C. Schuebel, J. E. Hedges, John H. Daly, J. S. Casto and H. Thiessen.
On motion, the chairman appointed the following committee on platform and name: Louis Funk, Robert A. Miller, George Ogle, T. R. A. Sellwood and O. W. Robbins.
After an adjournment of an hour, asked for further time, and were given until 7:30 p. m. However, they reported that they had agreed on a name: citizens' convention.

It was voted to call the ticket to be nominated the citizens' ticket.
The following were placed in nomination for representatives: Otto Gengelbach, J. S. Casto, Henry Breithaupt, declined, Gilbert L. Hedges, J. B. Zeigler, Elmer Dixon, declined, George Knights—George Ogle, declined, C. N. Wait, declined, C. E. Spence.
Conventions adjourned until 7:30 p. m.
The secretaries of the two previous conventions were made assistant secretaries of the joint convention.
When the convention re-assembled Chairman Latourette announced that the platform committee had not yet reported, and that it would be well to defer the nomination of representatives until a platform was adopted.
A motion to this effect carried.
A Lacey, G. C. Fields, C. Schuebel and C. N. Wait were appointed tellers. Nominations for county commissioners were announced to be in order, and the following were named, who received the annexed vote on the first ballot:
Spence named Levi Stehman, 45, of Molalla; Thiessen, G. A. Schuebel, 22, of Beaver Creek; Jones, T. E. Turner, 44, of Tualatin; Barlow, Mart Robbins, 35, of Marquam; Kenny, W. W. Myers, of Maple Lane, who declined; Lazelle, A. Lacey, 38, of Springwater; Suter, James Poe, 3, of Eagle Creek; James Coon, of Oswego; Mumpower, W. L. Cornett, 29, of Springwater; Gard, R. L. Ringo, 29, of Highland; Engle, George Adams, 20, of Molalla; E. J. Russell, of Oswego. Poe, Russell and Adams were withdrawn, and on the second ballot Stehman received 119 votes, Turner, 69, Robbins, 7, Lacey, 38, Coon, 3, Cornett, 24, Ringo, 5. Stehman and Turner were declared the nominees.
For sheriff Hiram Straight named J. J. Cooke, seconded by William Barlow and others. He was re-nominated by acclamation.
For clerk Hiram Straight named E. H. Cooper, of Carus, followed with several seconds. He was nominated by acclamation.
For recorder, L. Granzier, of Barlow, and H. Thiessen, of Milwaukie, and G. W. Owings, of Needy, were placed in nomination. Granzier received 21 votes, Thiessen, 27, and Owings, 2. Thiessen was declared the nominee, and made unanimous.
