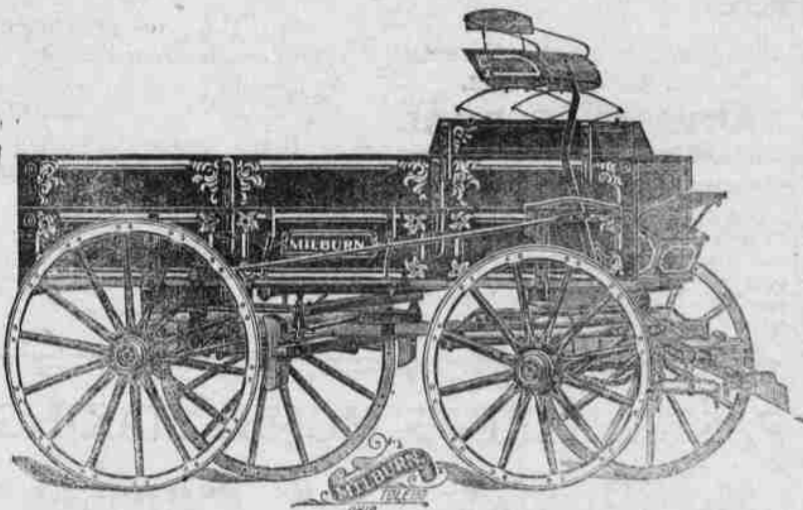

### BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS.

#### Regular July Term of the County Board.

J. H. Morton, John Lewellen and T. B. Killin, Commissioners.

In the matter of White, a county charge: It is ordered that she be transferred to the care and keeping of Mrs. Shoemaker for the sum of \$10 per month.

In the matter of the petition of M. C. Donahue, et al, for change in the O S Murray road: In the matter of a petition being filed by M C Donahue and more than 12 householders of the county living in the vicinity of the road described in the petition, and praying viewers to be appointed to view and locate a county road in Clackamas County, Oregon, described in full as follows: Beginning at the SW corner of Sec 2, T 2 S, R 4 E. Thence north on said line 3/4 of a mile to the NW corner of the S 1/2 of NW 1/4 of said section 2 T 2 S, R 4 E. Thence east on said line about 3/4 of a mile to a set stake marked R. A. Said stake in the center of Hood View Road, about 3 feet NE of a stump blazed on three sides, the stump being about two feet in diameter. Said road to be about 40 feet wide from beginning to terminus. Also to vacate such portions of the old road as the new survey covers. Said petitioner also filed his affidavit of notice posted respecting said road, showing that there had been posted one on the Court House Bulletin Board and three in three of the most public places in the vicinity of the proposed road more than thirty days prior to the presentation of this petition. He also filed a bond for \$100 conditioned according to law. Ordered that Wm Boring, Ed Seifer and John Richie be and are hereby appointed viewers to meet at the beginning on the 26th day of August, 1901, and subscribe to a written oath administered by Jno W Meldrum, deputy county surveyor, he being appointed by the Board to survey said road, before proceeding to view and locate said road, and report in writing the next regular term of the Board.

In the matter of funeral expenses of S. E. Millam, an indigent soldier, deceased. Ordered that said bill be paid in full amounting to \$30, and that the clerk issue the necessary warrants to cover same.

In the matter of petition of L. Humiston, for cancellation of school tax: This matter coming on by petition of L. Humiston filed herein, showing to the court that she was assessed for the year 1900 with a special school tax in School Dist. No 94 and that she has no land in Dist. No 94, all of her land being in Dist No 4, there being no special school tax in that district, and the Board being fully advised, it is ordered that the sheriff cancel said special school tax amounting to \$4.46 on page 614, line 6.

In the matter of the application of J T Apperson for settlement of taxes: Upon application of J T Apperson, by his attorney, H E Cross, who is now the owner of the NW 1/4 of SE 1/4, W 1/2 of NE 1/4, NE 1/4 of SW 1/4 of sec 32 T 6 S, R 2 E, containing 160 acres, made for the purpose of settling up all delinquent taxes upon said lands for the years 1895, 1896 and 1898, said land being the homestead of George D Cardew, and it appearing that the description of the lands attempted to be assessed for the year 1896 is fatally defective, it is ordered that the original tax for the said three years be accepted by the clerk in full satisfaction for said taxes and that all penalties be remitted.

In the matter of constructing a Dam in the Molalla river near the Upper Molalla Bridge: It appearing to the Board that there is danger of the Molalla river leaving its channel, it is ordered that James Dickey be appointed to construct a Dam in said river so as to keep the water in its channel, said Dam not to exceed \$100 in cost.

In the matter of petition of J J Cooke to correct description of certain lands in Sales Book: This matter coming on by petition of J J Cooke showing to the Board that on page 688, line 16, for the year 1897, Michael Pendleton was as-

essed with E 1/2 of NE 1/4 and E 1/2 of SE 1/4, sec 20, T 5 S, R 3 E, 160 acres; that the SE 1/4 of NE 1/4 of said description was paid on by Levi Robbins by Receipt No 4286, leaving a balance due of \$6.63 tax on NE 1/4 of NE 1/4 and E 1/2 of SE 1/4 sec 20, T 5 S, R 3 E, 120 acres which should be sold instead of E 1/2 of NE 1/4 and E 1/2 of SE 1/4, and asking the Board to instruct the clerk to correct the description on the Sales Book prepared for the sale of land to which Clackamas County has acquired title, so that said land will be described and sold as NE 1/4 of NE 1/4 and E 1/2 of SE 1/4, sec 20, T 5 S, R 3 E, 120 acres, it is ordered that the above described corrections be made.

In the matter of petition of C R Livesay for Rebate of tax: This matter coming on by petition of C R Livesay, filed herein showing to the Board that for the year 1900, he was assessed with 20 acres, being a part of the Geo Abernathy D L C, and at the time said assessment, he was the owner of only 15 acres; that by reason of such over assessment he has overpaid in taxes the amount of \$2.00, it is ordered that the clerk draw a warrant in favor of C R Livesay for the above amount.

In the matter of appointment of Deputy Recorder Louva Randall: This matter coming on by petition of Tom P Randall, it is ordered that said appointment be confirmed and Deputy allowed \$52 per month.

In the matter of Cost warrant of E E Judd: It appearing to the board that warrants Nos 5066 and 6276 drawn in favor of E E Judd were lost and the said Judd having given a bond as required, other warrants were issued in their stead, and it further appearing that said warrants Nos 6066 and 6276 have been found and returned to this Board, it is ordered that said warrants Nos 5066 and 6276 be and the same are hereby cancelled and held for naught and that the bondmen of E E Judd be released from further obligation to Clackamas County.

In the matter of James Wilson, a county charge: It is ordered that he be transferred to the care and keeping of Mrs. Thornton.

In the matter of Jane Carr, a county charge: It is ordered that she be transferred to the care and keeping of Alice Carr for the sum of \$10 per month.

In the matter of the petition of Geo S Young et al, for a county road known as the H R Baker road: Geo S Young and more than twelve householders of the county living in the vicinity of the road described in the petition, praying viewers to be appointed to view and locate a county road in Clackamas County, Oregon, described in full as follows: Beginning at a point where the 1/2 section line between sections 8 and 9, T 3 S, R 1 W, of the W M. Thence running east on said section line 10 rods, (at this point is a hill and it is understood that the turn in the road at this place shall be a rounding turn and not make the turn at right angles) Thence South to the county road at the Pleasant Hill cemetery. Said petitioner filed his affidavit of notice posted respecting said road, showing that there had been posted: one on the Court House bulletin board, and three in three of the most public places in vicinity of the proposed road more than 30 days prior to the presentation of this petition. He also filed a bond for \$100 conditioned according to law. It is ordered that W D Mathews, Geo Sneller and Ben Webster be and are hereby appointed viewers to meet at the beginning on the 30th day of August, 1901, and subscribe to a written oath of office administered by John W Meldrum, deputy county surveyor, he being appointed by the Board to survey said road and report in writing at the next regular term.

In the matter of petition of Theo Schmale for rebate of poll tax for year 1900: This matter coming on by petition of J J Cooke, showing to the Board that Theo Schmale was assessed for the year 1900 with a poll tax of \$3 00 and that on March 1, 1900, said Theo Schmale was over the age of 50 years and not liable for a poll tax under the laws of the State, it is ordered that the clerk draw a warrant in favor of Theo Schmale for the sum of \$3 for said poll tax.

In the matter of Joseph Allen, a county charge: It is ordered that Mrs Wineset be

and is hereby allowed the sum of \$15 per month for his care and keeping instead of \$13 as heretofore allowed.

In the matter of warrants Nos 8369 and 15,289: This matter coming on by statement of E H Cooper, clerk, showing to the Board that warrant No 8368, drawn on the general fund and warrant No 15,289, drawn on the road fund of Clackamas County, were erroneously drawn, it is ordered that said warrants be and the same are hereby cancelled and held for naught.

In the matter of the petition of Thos Wiles, et al, for a county road: Thos Wiles and more than 12 householders living in the vicinity of the road described in the petition filed, and praying viewers to be appointed to view and locate a county road in Clackamas County, Oregon, described in full as follows: Beginning at Liberal postoffice and following the old road to Wm Skeen's Southeast line between G A Bingman and Skeen; thence in a straight line southeasterly across the Bingman and Wiles farms to intersect with the old road coming out at a point between A Austin and T Wiles at an old fir tree, on the old road now in use; thence following the old road to the old Jackson farm now owned by W Vaughn. Said petitioner filed his affidavit of notice posted respecting said road, showing that there had been posted: One on the Court House bulletin board, and three in three of the most public places in vicinity of the proposed road more than 30 days prior to the presentation of this petition. He also filed a bond for \$100 conditioned according to law. It is ordered that J R Shaver, P L Schamel and L H Barnes be and are hereby appointed viewers to meet at the beginning on the 2nd day of Sept 1901 and subscribe to a written oath of office administered by John W Meldrum, deputy county surveyor, he being appointed by the Board to survey said road before proceeding to view and locate said road and report in writing at the next regular term of this Board.

In the matter of the claim of Charles Harnock against Clackamas County. This matter coming on, it is ordered that the same be and is hereby in all respects denied.

In the matter of plank for the Abernathy and Apperson roads: It is ordered that the clerk advertise for bids for 67,500 feet for Abernathy road and 64,800 feet for Apperson road Plank to be 16ft x 3in x 12 in to be delivered on the road ready for laying by Sept 20, 1901. Bids to be opened Aug 9, 1901, at 2 o'clock p m.

In the matter of plank for the Riche and Bradley road: Ordered that \$150 and six kegs of nails be allowed for the improvement of said road.

The Board met pursuant to adjournment. Commissioners and officers present as of the 19th

In the matter of the petition of G Houghum, for rebate of school tax: This matter now coming on by petition of G Houghum showing to the Board that he was assessed for and paid a special school tax in Dist No 19 for the year 1900 amounting to \$1.56 when there was no special school tax levied in said District for said year. And the Board being notified that said assessment was illegal, it is ordered that G Houghum have a rebate in the sum of \$1.56 and that the clerk draw a warrant for same.

In the matter of the petition of C T Street for cancellation of double assessment: This matter now coming on by petition of C Y Street showing to the Board that he was assessed and paid the taxes for 1897 on 14 1/2 acres in Sec 9, T 2 S, R 2 E in Clackamas County, Oregon, and that 6.7-16 acres of said land was assessed to B H Bowman for the same year and is now delinquent, and the Board being satisfied that the taxes on said land have been paid and that said assessment is a double assessment. It is ordered that the clerk cancel said double assessment, of record upon the Sales Book of 1897.

In the matter of the petition of Emma McDonald for Settlement of Taxes for 1893: This matter coming on by petition of Emma McDonald showing to the Board that Ludine Royal was assessed for the year 1893 with part of Lots 7 and 8 Bk 20 and that the assessment of said lots was erroneous in that the description was imperfect, that said taxes are delinquent and that the present owner and petitioner is desirous of settling the same, and the Board being fully advised, it is ordered that the clerk cancel the taxes for the said year 1893 on said property on payment of the sum of \$61.00 by petitioner.

In the matter of the Petrus and Struthers Road: It is ordered that J E Marquand, supervisor Road Dist No 27, open said road according to survey.

In the matter of Mileage and per diem of Commissioners: It is ordered by the Board that the mileage and per diem of the commissioners be allowed as follows, to-wit:

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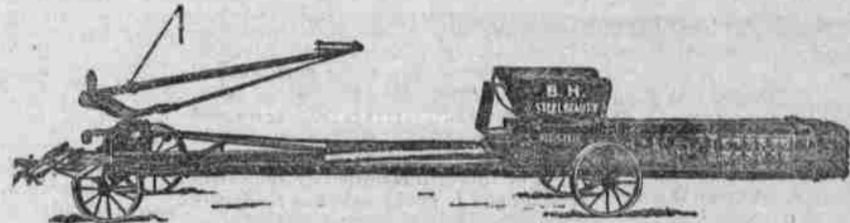
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
