itled so to do by the Act of the Legislature of 1901, known as Senate Bill No. 56, and on page 266 of said session laws of 1901.

And asking the Board to issue and make an order declaring said stream and the tributaries thereof as herein set forth, not to be navigable for commercial purposes, and to declare the same to be a public highway for the floating and transportation of saw logs, piling, lumber and wood and leasing to petitioner for 25 years of such time as the Board may deem proper, the absolute right to control said Molalla river and its tributaries within the boundaries set forth in this petition.

Now on motion of J W Draper, it is ordered that this matter be laid over until the January term, 1902.

In the matter of communication of W H Pope for improvement of County road: It is ordered that this matter be left to Commissioner J R Morton for consideration.

In the matter of application of P H Marlay for return of tax redemption money: Now comes P H Marlay and shows to the Board that on October 19th, 1901, he redeemed Blocks A and B, Clackamas Fruit Land for the year 1898, as shown by the Sales Book for said year, paying therefor the sum of \$7.22; that upon investigation he has found said blocks were doubly assessed for said year and that the taxes on one assessment have been paid, and the Board being fully advised it is ordered that P H Marlay have a rebate in the sum of \$7.22 and that the Clerk draw warrant for same.

In the matter of application of L Gurlinger for return of money paid for tax certificates: It is ordered that the matter be laid over until the January Term, 1902.

In the matter of reports of officers for month of Nov. 1901: The officers having made their reports and the Board having examined their books, and being fully advised, it is ordered that the same be and hereby is in all respects approved and accepted; said reports show collections as follows, to-wit: County Clerk.....\$374 35 County Recorder..... 223 65

In the matter of County Clerk's statement of scalps delivered during the month of November, 1901: This matter coming on upon Clerk's report of scalps turned in and warrants issued and the Board being fully advised, it is ordered that the same be and hereby is in all respects approved.

In the matter of assessment of northeast quarter of section eight, township five south, range three east: Now at this time comes on to be heard the above matter and it appearing that said land was sold to the State Land Board on July 21st, 1900, and therefore was not assessable and that the same was assessed to J Gorbett and is advertised for sale for delinquent taxes, it is ordered that said property be not sold by the Sheriff on December 14th, 1901, as per advertisement for 1900 tax.

In the matter of changes of allowances of County charges: It is ordered that the allowance of Mrs Wilhoit be changed from \$12 to \$15; Mrs Tricheer from \$10 to \$12; it is further ordered that Amanda Wilcox, Abraham Yates and Ida C Gartman receive no further aid from Clackamas County.

In the matter of petition of R DeShazer to vacate Maple avenue, Clackamas River side: Now comes on to be heard the petition of R DeShazer et al praying the Board to vacate that part of Maple Avenue, Clackamas River side, as the same is platted and of record in the office of the County Recorder of Clackamas County, and it further appearing to the Board that a remonstrance against said petition has been filed with the Board, it is therefore ordered that said petition be laid over until January 4th, 1902, at 10 o'clock.

In the matter of Jas. Adkins, supervisor Road District No 17: It appearing to the Board that this report was laid over at the November term for the reason that said supervisor had not complied with the order of the Board, and now on this date, the Board being fully advised, it is ordered that said report be allowed in full and that the amount of said report paid out of road fund be taken from the apportionment of said district in 1902.

In the matter of the new bridge near Canby and Barlow: It is ordered that said bridge be insured for \$5000 in the Springfield Fire and Marine Insurance Company of Springfield, Massachusetts.

In the matter of petition of Edward Wright for aid: Now comes Edward Wright and submits a written statement, showing to the Board that through accident and divers misfortunes he is left destitute and without any means of earning a living during the winter, and the Board being fully advised, it is ordered, that Edward Wright be allowed \$8 per month from the 1st day of December, 1901, until the 1st day of May, 1902.

In the matter of repairing the Beaver Creek and Highland road: It appearing to the Board that said road is worn out and in a dangerous con-

dition, it is ordered that Commissioner John Lewellen be and is hereby authorized to let contracts for lumber and have said road repaired as soon as practicable.

In the matter of petition of T O Kidding, et al, for County Road: In the matter of the petition filed by T O Kidding and more than twelve householders of the county living in the vicinity of the road described in the petition, and praying viewers to be appointed to view and locate a county road in Clackamas County, Oregon, described in full as follows:

Beginning at a point where the "No-laud Mill and Gribble Prairie Road" crosses the North line of Section 26, in Tp 5 S, R 1 E, in said county, thence running South 80 rods; thence West to intersect the center line of said road; and to vacate all present travelled roads between said terminal points except the road running East and West on the North side of said Section 26.

Said petitioner filed his affidavit of notices posted respecting said road, showing that there had been posted, one on the Court house bulletin board, and three in three of the most public places in vicinity of proposed road, more than 30 days prior to the presentation of this petition. He also filed bond for One Hundred Dollars conditioned according to law.

The Board being fully advised, it is ordered that W H Engle, A Myers and W A Shaver be and are hereby appointed viewers to meet at the beginning on the 23rd day of December, 1901, and to subscribe to a written oath of office administered by E P Rands, County Surveyor, he being appointed by the Board to survey said road, before proceeding to view and locate said road and report in writing at the next regular term of this Board.

In the matter of repairs of the Ross Bridge: This matter now coming on to be heard, on presentation of report of W J Cuiver, Road Master for Marion County, Oregon, showing that Marion County has expended \$321.00 in repairing what is known as Ross Bridge over Butte Creek, and presenting to this Board a bill for \$160.50 as Clackamas County's share of said repairs, and it appearing to the Board that said bridge is a joint bridge with Marion County and that Clackamas County is liable for one-half of said expenses, it is ordered that a warrant be drawn in favor of Marion County for \$160.50 to pay for one-half of said improvements.

In the matter of petition of W W Irvin for rebate of taxes: Now comes on to be heard the petition of W W Irvin, showing to the Board that for the year 1900, 20 acres of his land lying on the south side of Pudding River was assessed in both Marion and Clackamas Counties; that said land is in Marion County and that Marion County is entitled to the taxes thereon; and that both assessments have been paid. And the Board being fully advised, it is ordered that W W Irvin have a rebate in the sum of \$2.43, the amount of taxes paid to Clackamas County by reason of said assessment.

In the matter of petition of E F Riley for return of money paid at tax sale of 1899: Now comes on to be heard the petition of E F Riley showing to the Board that the sale of lands for the delinquent taxes of 1898 held on the 21st day of October, 1899, Clackamas County offered for sale for taxes of 1898 twenty-one acres of land in the Donation Land Claim of Hector Campbell in said county belonging to and assessed in the name of Samuel Finger; that petitioner purchased said land paying therefor the sum of \$18.85, the amount of said taxes, interest and costs; that it now appears that on the 5th day of September, 1899, said Samuel Finger paid the taxes on said property, which was a part of a 42 acre tract, and that he received a tax receipt in full for the taxes of 1898 on the whole 42 acres, said receipt being numbered 2370.

And the Board being fully satisfied that said sale of said property was void and that said purchaser acquired no title under said sale, it is therefore ordered that the \$18.85 paid by E F Riley for said property be returned to him with interest at six per cent and that the Clerk issue a warrant for the same.

In the matter of Ida C Gartman, a County Charge: It appearing to the Board that Ida C Gartman has left Clackamas County, it is ordered that warrant No 9490, drawn December 2nd for her support, be cancelled and that she receive no further aid from Clackamas County.
