## EXPENSE & COUNTIES Yambill Expense of capital,

POOR SHOWING OF CLACKA-MAS COUNTY.

Banner County in Regard to Expenses for 1901-\$1,050,000 Paid Out in State.

Salem, Feb. 28.—the total expendi-tures of the sever 1 counties of the state for the year 1901, exclusive of roadbuilding, was \$1,049,580.84. This is shown by a statement issued by Secretary of State Dunbar. The figures are taken from the reports of the several county clerks filed with the secretary of state as required by the act of the last legisla-ture. The average expenses of the counties for 1901 and the tour succeeding years will be taken as the basis for the apportionment of state taxes after the period named has expired.

Secretary of State Dunbar has pro-pared tables showing the population of each county according to the last census, the assessed valuation of property, the total area, and the percentages of state taxes that would be paid on the basis of last year's expenditures. As this last matter is the chief purpose of the new law, the effect it will have upon the opportlonment of state taxes is of greatest

interest. Under the present law, Multnomah county is paying 31 23 per cent of the state taxes. Upon the basis of expenditures for 1901, that county would pay but 24.18 per cent. Clackamas county, under the present system, pays 3.35 per All work warranted and satisfaction guaranteed Crown and Bridge work a specialty years, at the same comparative rate, would require that county to pay 6.62 per cent of the state taxes. On the other hand, Linn and Marion counties, which have kept their expenses down, are in a fair way to experience a reduq-

tion in their state tax burden. In the following table is shown the rank the various counties take in the matter of population, assessed valuation and expenditures. Thus, for example, it will be seen that Marion county is second in both population and valuation, but drops down to fourth place on the amount of expenditures. Clackamas county, on the other hand, is third in papulation, seventh in valuation, but rises to second place when it comes to spending the money. Umatilla county ranks third on county expenses, but is sixth in population and lifth in valua-Multnomah and Curry counties are the only ones maintaining the same rank in all particulars, Douglas and Linn.

Eenton counties are quite uniform.

Douglas is ninth in population, eighth in valuation and eighth in expenses.
