At the afternoon session, the report of the committee on order of business was read, and accepted.

The report of the committee on credentials showed that all the precincts were represented, except Cascade and Cherrystone, and the total vote of the convention was 287.

The temporary officers were made permanent. On motion four tellers, W. T. Johnston, of Clackamas; E. E. Charman, of Oregon City; L. W. Robinson, of Molalla, and George Knight, of Canby, were appointed.

The first order of business was the nomination of a state senator. W. H. Engle, who was seconded by George Ogle and others, presented the name of George W. Grace.

For representatives, R. B. Beatie presented the name of O. N. Wait, of Canby; E. E. Charman named O. F. Eastham; H. E. Cross named C. F. Clark, of Clackamas; Dr. J. W. Norris named G. L. Hedges, of Canby; J. M. Turner named M. N. Crissel, of Union.

For sheriff, J. E. Jack was named by C. D. Latourette. G. F. Clark presented the name of William Johnson, of Damascus. Ira Jones named E. D. Olds. A. A. Kenny named J. R. Myers, of Maple Lane.

For recorder, L. E. Grazer, of Barlow, was named by J. E. Hedges, and received the nomination by acclamation. George Knight, of Canby, was named by Abbott, but declined.

For county commissioner, W. F. Young, of Pleasant Hill; C. W. Risley, of Milwaukie; A. E. Alspaugh, of Eagle Creek; E. J. Russell, of Oswego, and Charles Moehne, of West Oregon City, were named.

For treasurer, Alfred Luelling, of Milwaukie, was named by T. R. A. Sellwood, and received the nomination by acclamation.

J. J. Cooke was elected chairman of the campaign committee, and Elmer Dixon, secretary.

H. G. Starkweather made an excellent presiding officer, and the secretary and assistant secretary, Louis Funk and W. F. Young, did efficient work.

The citizens convention of Clackamas county composed of delegates from all the precincts of the county, non-partisan in character, with a sincere and determined purpose to relieve the overburdened taxpayers of the county from the selfish domination of the most corrupt ring that has ever fastened itself upon any people.

We further agree and publish the following resolutions and statements of financial status of the county: First—We demand that the election of United States senator shall be by direct vote of all the people.

Second—We heartily in favor of the Initiative and Referendum amendment now pending for a popular vote at the coming election.

Third—We view with alarm the present financial condition in the county. In 1893 after the extraordinary expenses connected with the construction of the court house, the suspension bridge and the Baker's Ferry bridge, amounting to about \$80,000, the county was in debt \$57,925.

Fourth—By comparison, we note according to the official figures that it cost, exclusive of roads, \$5.04 per capita to pay the running expenses of Clackamas county for a year.
