MADE MANAGER

OF FOUR CHAUTAUQUA ASSOCIATIONS.

Hon. Harvey E. Cross Has Additional Honors Thrust Upon Him.

Hon. Harvey E. Cross, who has been in San Francisco for the past ten days, returned the first of the week. Mr. Cross' business in San Francisco was to confer with other Chautauqua managers about talent for the coming year. Because of his well known ability in handling Chautauquas, Mr. Cross was made manager of the four Chautauquas of the Pacific coast—Long Beach, near Los Angeles; Pacific Grove, near Monterey; Ashland and Gladstone. Mr. Cross will have the task of closing all contracts with speakers and educators for the coming season and arranging the itineraries. No announcement will be made of the talent till the contracts have been closed. Heretofore, a speaker has been advertised before the contract has been signed.

This year's Chautauqua promises to be the best that has ever been held at Gladstone. A number of speakers with a national reputation have been selected, and if contracts are made with them the Assembly will have the best sustained programme in the history of the Willamette Valley Chautauqua Association. Political speakers of a national reputation have been agreed upon, among them being such men as Senators Doliver and Beveridge. While such men will cost the Association considerable money, it is believed that it will be a great drawing card.

The Chautauqua this year will be from July 14 to 26, one day later than heretofore. It will close on Sunday with a special religious program. Mr. Cross will start to work at once securing speakers and arranging for the program.
