In the matter of repairing the Randall and Penman hill. Ordered that if Mr. Randall and Mr. Penman contribute \$25, and if the road supervisor considers it necessary, that there be \$25 out of county fund contributed.

In the matter of repairs of Holman bridge in District No. 19. Ordered that supervisor build a new bridge at said place.

In the matter of a bridge on Oregon City and Silverton road, near Weismandel's, in District No. 25. Ordered that supervisor of said district repair said bridge.

In the matter of the petition of James Lavelle for a county road. Ordered that the board of county road viewers meet at place of beginning on 23th day of June, 1903.

In the matter of the petition to vacate part of Shockley road. Ordered that board of county road viewers meet on June 25, 1903.

In the matter of the Kruse bridge, in District No. 31. Ordered that supervisor of said district rebuild same.

In the matter of repairs to Springwater road, in District No. 12. Road Supervisor Sprague instructed to proceed with improvement in accordance with his plan.

In the matter of the petition of I. L. James for a county road and for vacation of part of the Eagan & Garrett mill road. Ordered that board of county road viewers meet on the 27th of June, 1903.

In the matter of assistance to Sarah Carr, indigent person. Ordered that Joseph Carr, of Newberg, and Amos Carr, of Bridal Veil, be notified to care for said Sarah Carr, their sister.

In the matter of the care of Mrs. Valentine and C. C. Lewis, indigent persons. Ordered that warrant issue to said Mrs. Valentine for \$18 per month for care of said persons until further orders.

In the matter of the report of viewers of P. C. Miller road. Read first time and laid over until tomorrow for second reading.

In the matter of the report of viewers of J. Strous road. Report read first time and laid over until tomorrow for second reading.

In the matter of the application of Joe Simon for redemption of land from sale of taxes to Clackamas county. Ordered that said Joseph Simon be permitted to redeem said land for years 1899, 1900 and 1901, upon payment of the sum of \$400.

In the matter of lumber for Abernethy road. Ordered that offer of W. H. Bonney to furnish lumber at \$6.75 per thousand, to the extent of 100,000 feet delivered on said road as may be directed by W. H. Council, the superintendent.

In the matter of bids for construction of addition and changes in court house. Bids were opened at 2 o'clock and were as follows: E. B. White, \$4832; J. Zennel, \$4741.85; Johnson & Andrews, \$3294. Ordered that clerk return certified checks to E. B. White and J. Zennel, and that bid of Johnson & Andrews be taken under advisement.

In the matter of the appointment of deputy sheriffs by Sheriff John R. Shaver. Ordered that appointments be confirmed and such deputies to act without pay.

In the matter of the appointment of board of county road viewers. Ordered that D. W. Kinnard, John Lewellen, be appointed to act with John W. Meldrum, county surveyor, as such board.

In the matter of the funeral expenses of Greenleaf Chute, indigent soldier. Ordered that upon certificate of commander of Meade Post, G. A. R., that said Greenleaf Chute was an indigent soldier, without means or property, and that funeral expenses amounted to \$45, that clerk issue warrant to said commander for said expense.

In the matter of deeds from R. Scheibel and Lottie Schmeibel for lands for road purposes. Ordered that said deeds be accepted and that they be recorded without charge.

In the matter of the petition of L. Woodcock for removal of obstructions in Oerude and Struthers road. Ordered that supervisor remove obstructions from said road as per survey to be made by county surveyor.

In the matter of the case of P. H. Marley vs. Clackamas county. Ordered that taxes for years 1893, 1894 and 1895 be canceled.

In the matter of the petition of G. W. Scramlin for telephone privileges on certain county roads. Ordered that petition be granted subject to provisions of laws regulating same.

In the matter of the remonstrance of citizens of Boring precinct against granting liquor license in said Boring precinct. Ordered that remonstrance be placed on file, as no petition for liquor license has been filed.

In the matter of the report of viewers of P. C. Miller road. Report read a second time and report accepted, and road ordered opened with work of petitioners, and expense account of survey be paid by Clackamas county, as follows: Chas. Daugherty \$2.40, E.
