SALEM, Or., Dec. 21.—(Special).—The Supreme Court today decided the case of Kadderly vs. Portland, upholding the validity of the referendom amendment and declaring that it is the province of the Legislature and not of the courts to determine when an emergency 25 at Geo, A. Harding's drug store. exists. The initiative and referendum amendment is therefore a part of the constitution. Under the construction LEGAL ADVERTISEMENTS

placed upon its language by the Supreme Court, the Legislature can place any act in effect immediately by declar-ing that the preservation of the public health, peace or safety requires that the act shall take effect at once. The opinion in the case was written by Justice R. S. Bean. It fills 36 pages of type-written legal cap paper, and discusses at length all the questions involved and quotes from a large number of authorities.

It was quite generally expected that the decision would be handed down to-day and a number of members of the Legislature were in the court room when the court convened at 12 o'clock. The ecision will be of some effect on legislation contemplated at this session, for, under this decision, there can be no ques-tion as to the power of the Legislature to put a remedial tax law into effect at once and to, correct in the same manner the defects in other laws.


