The Pomona At Oswego

Quarterly Meeting of the Clackamas
County Grange—Various Resolutions Adopted.

The Pomona Grange met with Oswego Grange on Wednesday of last week. A number of patrons came from a distance, who were hospitably entertained and lodged by the good people of Oswego. The attendance was good. Only a condensed statement of the proceedings can be given.

The following resolution was adopted: That the master of the Pomona Grange appoint a member of each subordinate grange for the purpose of circulating the petition to the legislature for a direct primary law.

On account of the time when the petition with its signatures must be on file with the secretary of state, which is February 6th, the circulation of the petition will be expedited as much as possible.

Mrs. Niblin, of Evening Star Grange, installed the following Pomona officers for the year. She performed this duty in an ideal manner, off-hand, and in poetic language, in fact, as the grange ritual flows from her tongue it is poetry. That the lady is not by any means unhandsome renders the task she performs so well all the more interesting. The grange thanked her with a rising vote.

Miss Helen Sprague assisted in the installation as conductress. Oswego Grange has a piano and not the least interesting phase of the installation was the instrumental music accompanying it.

Eaton; treasurer, T. L. Turner; secretary, C. E. Spence; gatekeeper, Ed Bates; officers, Della Guttridge; Pomona, Maggie Johnson; Flora, E. T. B. Thomas; L. A. S., Rose Robbins.

Robert Shibel introduced two resolutions, one in regard to assessing bankers and the other in regard to giving the state supreme court more power, which were voted down.

Sister Maggie Johnson's resolution that the grangers make an exhibit of their agricultural products in Portland during the presence of the National Grange, was adopted by unanimous vote.

Twenty dollars was voted from funds in the treasurer's hands for purchase of new paraphernalia.

By a rising vote the following resolution was adopted introduced by Bro. Chitwood:

Whereas, Our highly esteemed Brother and Co-worker, J. S. Casto, is deprived, by sickness, of meeting with the brothers and sisters of Clackamas Pomona Grange in session at Oswego, in the county where our brother has done so much for the promotion of grange principles, therefore, be it

Resolved, That we express our appreciation of the work of our good brother during the years gone by and devoutly hope that we may again be honored by his presence and grasp his hand of fellowship and again hear his voice in behalf of the cause which we know he loves so dearly.

A. M. Shibley introduced a resolution in regard to a parcel post and postal note which was adopted.

On the 20th of this month, said Bro. Sawtell of Molalla 310, delegates from the several subordinate granges will hold a meeting at Maple Lane grange hall for the purpose of forming a moor pool, and possibly discussing a wool pool.

Mrs. Howard read a letter from J. O. Wing, state business agent of the grange of Washington county.

Resolution passed that the secretary correspond with the object of securing bids for binder twine.

Garfield Grange, No 317, through Brother Hawkins, invited the Pomona to visit it in April, which was unanimously accepted. The Garfield grange hall is a few miles from the brand-new railroad town of Estacada.

The following resolution presented by Bro. C. E. Spence was adopted: Whereas, The Clackamas Pomona Grange has earnestly supported the Initiative and Referendum for a number of years, therefore, be it Resolved, That this Pomona Grange

is highly gratified with the recent decision of the Oregon Supreme Court in holding that the Direct Legislation amendment was legally enacted, and trusts that the emergency clause may soon be confined to such cases as it was intended for.

By resolution \$4 was denoted to each of the three granges, Harding, Warner and Highland.

State Secretary Mary Howard announced that next month delegates must be elected for the county convention at Oregon City on March 8th, which will elect delegates to the State Grange.
