MARKET REPORT.

FRESH SALMON IS HIGHER.

The receipts of salmon in this market show another advance of 10 a pound on both chinook and steelhead on account of a scarcity. There is not near enough fish coming now to supply the demand and even Sacramento is unable to fill the outside orders.

BUTTER STILL VERY WEAK.

Despite the assurances of the larger cream-ery men that they are not cutting their quotations of their printed lists, retailers continue to receive telephone messages and circulars telling of lower prices for them exclusively.

MORE EGGS ARE COMING.

The high prices which have lately been offered out in the country for eggs seem to be drawing at last, for the receipts of stocks this morning were larger than any previous day during the last month.

THE SLUMP IN POTATOES.

Very heavy receipts of potatoes in the San Francisco market and a consequent lowering of prices there has caused a drop of about 15c a hundred in the quotations on the medium grade stocks in this market.

SUGAR IS VERY FIRM.

The advance of 10c a hundred in the quotations on sugar which was exclusively mentioned in the Journal yesterday, was brought about by the placing of heavy orders for sugar by the larger fruit canners of the country.
