Another Loss.

The fairly reliable details of the great land battle May 1, near the Yalu are now obtainable. There seems to be no denying the fact that Russia has sustained a severe shock in the loss of 2000 men and 700 wounded. The mere loss in men is not so galling to Russia as the loss in prestige sustained. While the advance files the Japanese with renewed patriotism, they are getting further from their base of supplies while the Russians are getting nearer to theirs. Now that the armies have come face to face with each other more heavy fighting may be expected.

Strikes Threatened. A number of strikes are in prospect as well as a number which have already begun. Over 800 machinists and allied workers on the Atchafalaya, Topeka & Santa Fe walked out. The complaint of the men is that they are constantly shadowed by spotters and detectives in the employ of the company. In Chicago 6200 men are out because of differences in scale of wages. Portions of New York and the New England states are affected by bakers and carpenters' strikes.

Local Option. It was not thought when the local option measure was prepared that quite so much effort would be put forth by its friends and by its opponents as are being manifested now. A number of speakers favoring the measure have been touring the state. Meanwhile, the liquor dealers have not been idle. Wednesday the retail dealers of Portland, met to discuss the position they should take in the coming election. The sense of the meeting was that they should favor no particular candidates, but that their whole effort should be to defeat local option.
