### TO INSTALL MACHINERY.

Ogle Mining Company Installs Stamp Mill and Cyanide Plant.

Ogle Mountain Mining Company, whose extensive mining properties are located near the headwaters of the Molalla river in this county are making arrangements for the purpose of purchasing machinery equipment for their mines.

Stamp mill and small cyanide plant will be purchased and shipped to this city within a few days, and it is the intention of the managers to immediately pack the mill into the mines and put it to operation before the season is too far gone. There is at present about 1000 tons of ore on the dump that is ready for milling.

Miners are pushing the work rapidly on the company's main mine, Russell No. 1, having completed about 900 feet tunnel work. The ledge in this claim has been struck at the 200-foot level.

The company is constructing a wagon road over which they will haul their heavy machinery. The road is now completed within a short distance of the mines.

Several fine specimens of ore have been taken from these mines and the outcrops of the mines look very promising. There is an exhibition at the Lewis and Clark Exposition in Portland and a number of fine samples taken from this mine.

### Make Rich Strike.

Word has reached this city to the effect that the Venture mine that a big ledge has been struck on the properties located on the south fork of the Santiam river.

The Venture Mining Company is composed of prominent Oregon City business men, who have been putting all efforts forth in the event of doing much development work in their mines in the Santiam district during the past several years.

Several days ago the employees at the "Venture" struck ledge of several feet across the face. They have at the present time driven their tunnel something like seven and one-half feet through this rich ore matter, which assays at \$6.50 per ton. They claim that they are still in the paying ore, which they have not yet gone through, and that the prospects of the mine even showing up better looks very encouraging.

### Map of Mail Route.

City Engineer Rands has just completed an official map of the county roads leading from Barton, Sandy and Kelso, Or., with a view of showing up to the government authorities the route to be taken in the event of the establishment of a free rural mail route.

The map will at once be forwarded to the postoffice Department at Washington, D. C., where the route will be considered, and if thought of in a favorable manner by the department the mail route between these points will be established at once.

Mr. Moores did little talking to his old Clackamas neighbors, giving the impression that when he runs it will be "at the urgent solicitation of many friends."

### County Court Adjourned.

Judge Thomas McBride adjourned circuit court Saturday night after holding a special session during the past week. The work done by the court during the past week was very light. Quite a number of decrees of divorce were granted and several orders issued. An order was filed Saturday extending to plaintiff in G. A. Marquardt vs. A. J. Mouldenauer extension of time to file his bill of exceptions and complete his appeal to the supreme court until Aug. 1, 1905.

Decree of divorce was granted to Mabel C. Hanson against C. E. Hanson, giving her the care, custody, nurture and education of the minor child, Geraldine Hanson. In the matter of the application of Josephine Curran for registration of land title to a part of the J. A. Wade donation land claim in this county, it was ordered that the title be referred to V. R. Hyde for examination, who was appointed by the court as examiner of title for that purpose.

### SUPT. ZINSER'S ANNUAL REPORT.

School Statistics Given for Clackamas County.

County Superintendent J. C. Zinser has completed his annual report on the school situation of Clackamas county for the year of 1904-5, and has mailed it to state school superintendent. The report shows the following statistical facts: Number of children of school age within the county—boys, 4284; girls, 3,960. Number of teachers—male, 34; female, 165. Children not attending school—male, 211; female, 895. Children attending school outside of district—male, 117; female, 127. Average daily attendance, 4167 9/10.

There are 120 districts in the county and 122 schoolhouses. Two school houses were built last year. The county has 4275 legal voters at school election. Schools are run on an average of 7.4 months.

Superintendent paid 95 school visits and traveled 2000 miles; held one county institute and three local institutes. The local libraries contain 5380 volumes and 739 books were purchased during last year. Private schools in the county employ six teachers and have 173 pupils. Report shows the disbursement in teachers' wages were \$58,474.90, and the average salary paid the women was \$40.60; men, \$49.72. Schoolhouses in the county are valued at \$147,995. Cash on hand from last year was \$15,402.18 and the total cash on hand as shown in this report is \$13,728.83.


