

Clackamas County's Display of Products Causes Feople to Sit Up and Take Notice.

PORTLAND, Or., Aug 15,-The million mark has been reached and in the record of attendance at the Lewis and Clark Exposition. When the 27,420 admissions of August

were added to the aggregate since the fair opened on June 1, it was found that in sixty-three days 1,013,-551 of gate admissions had been re-corded by the turnstiles. ment of admissions at Portland, who has had experience in the same depart-ment at several expositions, expresses a verdict for the plaintiff. the belief that the Lewis and Clark Fair will run Omaha a close race, and in all probability will win out in the total attendance, though at Omaha the exposition was open five full months, while the present enterprise is to be open but four and a half months. Omaha's total attendance was 2,613,508.


