### **ENGINEER'S** CLOSE CALL

Explosion of Boiler at the Dodge Sawmill.

BUILDING IS DEMOLISHED

Piece of Boiler, Weighing a Ton, Blown 250 Yards Over a Hill 40 Feet High.

W. E. Myers, of Dodge, was in the city Monday afternoon, and gave a graphic account of the bursting of a boiler at the Dodge sawmill late last

boiler at the Dodge sawmill late last Tuesday afternoon. The mill is owned by Mr. Myers and his father, J. T. Myers, under the firm name of J. T. Myers & Son.

"The boiler was crowded with steam at the time of the accident," said Mr. Myers, "and the engine was out of order. My son, Elvin Myers, the engineer, went to see what was wrong with the engine and while he was making an examination the steam raised. The governor flew off from raised. The governor flew off from the engine, releasing the steam, caus-ing the boiler to burst with a frighting the boiler to burst with a fright-ful explosion. Elvin saw the governor fly off, and started to run, but was tripped and fell headlong. This was the only thing that saved his life, as huge pieces of the boiler blew directly over his head. [One part of the boiler, weighing probably a ton, was blown 250 yards, over a hill 40 feet high from the level of the boiler. The top of the hill was 200 yards distant. The the hill was 200 yards distant. The building was entirely demolished, and the other boiler, which was not un-der steam, was turned completely around. My son's escape is nothing short of mirasulous."
