HE IS DISLIKED IN CLACKAMAS

Pleasant Hill Precinct Refuses to Support Jonathan Bourne for Senator.

REPUBLICANS WILL VOTE FOR GEARIN

Ghosts of the Past Cause Residents to Turn Their Backs Upon the Bourne-Brownell Combination and Demand Clean Politics.

WILSONVILLE, Or., May 24.—In this splendid agricultural section of the country one feels an impression creeping over him that the center of political activity is no longer in the city, but that the whole country has become deeply interested in local, state and national government. In this locality a peculiar situation prevails. Pleasant Hill precinct is probably the strongest Republican precinct in Clackamas county—that is to say, other political parties have the least representation in proportion to the whole number of voters.

Yet it is generally understood that Pleasant Hill refuses to accept Jonathan Bourne for United States senator and to make their votes count against him the Republicans will vote for John Gearin. It might naturally seem that this is on account of a kindly feeling toward Gearin on account of his having made his way from farmer boy, born on an Oregon farm, to a place alongside the foremost men of Oregon, and throughout his career having shown that sterling integrity and honesty of purpose that won him, immediately on his entry into the United States senate, the hearty commendation and praise of such outspoken and incorruptible Republicans as Senator La Follette, of Wisconsin.

But in reality the citizens of this locality are not so much Gearin men, but they are uncompromising anti-Bourne men. The feeling is prevalent that Bourne succeeded in obtaining the Republican nomination by a lavish expenditure of money and that he is a man who has always pursued the policy of gaining political preferment by immense drafts on the millions he inherited from his father's estate.

But there is another reason for the strong anti-Bourne feeling, and that lies in the fact that the people generally know about the Bourne-Brownell combination, wherein Bourne furnishes the money and Brownell disposes of it. The people of this section know Brownell. Pleasant Hill precinct is about 125 votes strong, and in the April primary election Brownell received 16 votes. It is doubtful if he will receive even 16 votes in the coming election.

Most of the voters here are well-to-do farmers and Brownell can accomplish nothing with his fat campaign fund, not even with promises of office and lucrative positions. Bourne is not known here as a Republican, but as a political adventurer who sought to ride into the senate through the Populist party, and who, when he realized that the Populist party was going to pieces, was first to desert it and hurry into the Republican camp.

These politicians who are eagerly grasping for office and care not what the price just so they get office will fare no better in Union precinct than in Pleasant Hill. Union is not a large precinct, but is made up, in the main, of thrifty farmers. Tualatin precinct also joins Pleasant Hill and is a strong Democratic precinct. It is about as large as Pleasant Hill and here Brownell, in the primary election, received 17 votes. There is no prospect of his getting more in the June election. Chris Schuebel, who is Bourne's right-hand-man in Clackamas county, claims to be able to handle the German vote for Bourne, but the German population of this county, which is not large, is independent and doesn't fancy the idea of being whipped around from one party to another and used to further the political ambitions of a few men. These people are of the most intelligent citizens of the county, and are, as a rule, in sympathy with President Roosevelt. They know, too, that to place the Bourne-Brownell combination in power is to array the political machinery of Oregon alongside the political machinery of the other states that are laying plans to do Roosevelt up.

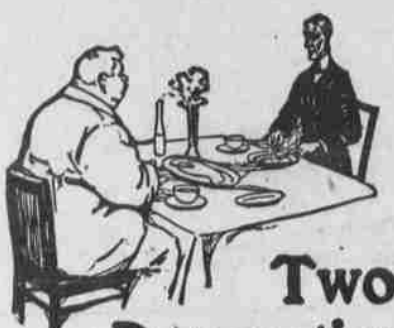
An amusing incident occurred a few evenings ago at a Republican political meeting in Tualatin precinct. Nearly every body in that locality has a warm feeling for Governor Chamberlain. While a Republican candidate was exhorting Republicans to stand by the party and help Dr. Witherscombe out, a gust of wind extinguished every lamp in the hall. Simultaneously the shout went up for Chamberlain and the speaker, thus learning the temper of his audience, dropped the subject of gubernatorial preference and proceeded along lines more congenial to the crowd.

If the vote of Clackamas county were confined to the farming districts, the Bourne-Brownell combination would make a sorry showing in Clackamas county. Such is the case at least in this southwestern section of the county is a fair indication of the feeling toward this class of men.—Special Dispatch in Oregon Journal.

representative, who spiked some of the biggest guns of the opposition, but he did it in such a kindly and masterful way that the strongest partisan could take no offense.

"Stand by Roosevelt and elect John Doe to the high and exalted position of inspector of skyscrapers in Clackamas City," has been the Republican slogan throughout the campaign. Mr. Eby showed that the opposition does not seem to know the boomerangish, dynamitic character of the expression. He said that Roosevelt sent a member of his cabinet—Secretary Taft—into Ohio, to make speeches against Republican candidates who did not measure up to the President's ideal of Republicanism; that the President helped to turn down a corrupt treasurer in the state of Pennsylvania, Republican though he was. He said that an impression is prevalent that Roosevelt is somewhat opposed to the way certain Clackamas county Republicans, and that vague rumors of indictments were now and then waited in on the gentle breeze and that they were the result of investigations directed by the President. He asked the voters to consider whether Roosevelt would vote or straight if he were a citizen of Clackamas county. Hanging on to Roosevelt's coat-tails is the Big Man in this county affair and a number of Little Men are hanging on to the Big Man's coat-tail, all hoping and trusting that they will land in public office.

Idella K. White, who was married August 1, 1898, in Oregon City, to Charles White, has commenced suit for divorce, and asks for \$25 per month alimony. She alleges that her husband struck her in the fall of 1899, just after she was out of the hospital, when she was weak and infirm. In 1901 he cursed her and threatened to take her life, drawing a pocket knife and slashing her clothes.
